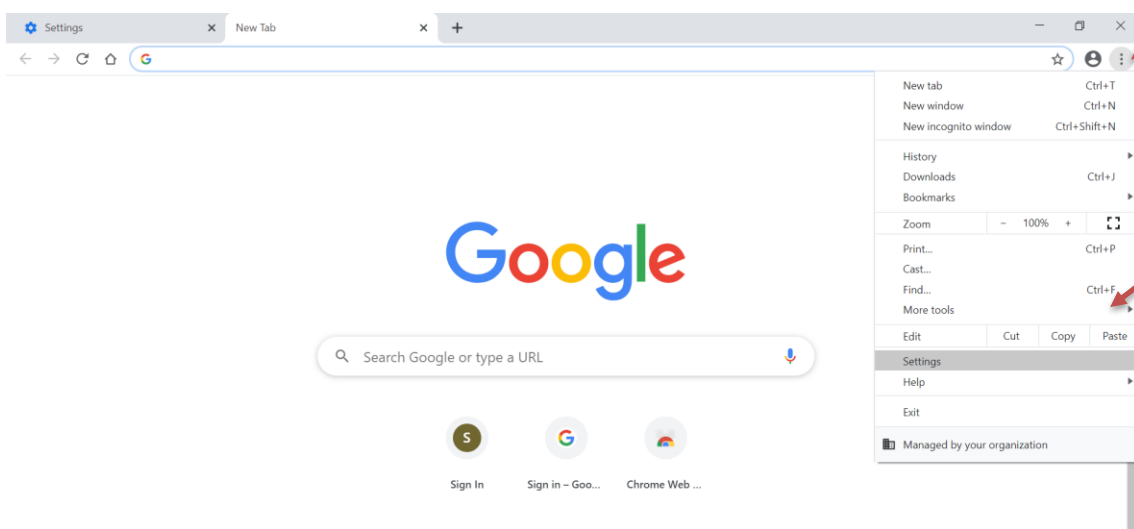

Chrome – Clear Cache

When you use a browser, like Chrome, it saves some information from websites in its cache and cookies. Clearing them fixes certain problems, like loading or formatting issues on sites.

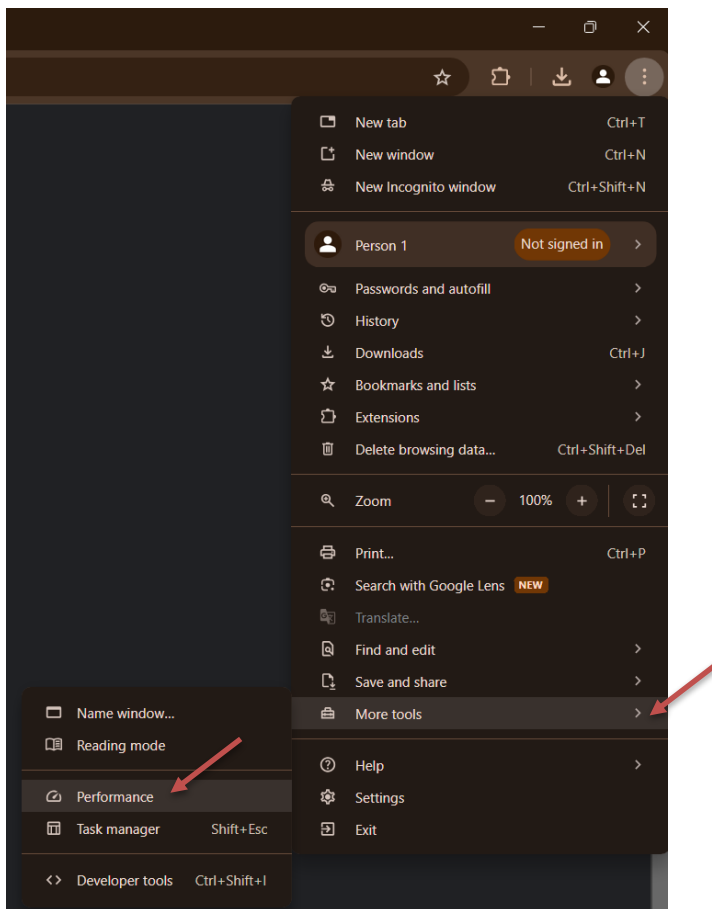
Clear Cache

1. On your computer, open Chrome.
2. At the top right, click on the three dots in the top right corner
3. Scroll down to 'More Tools'

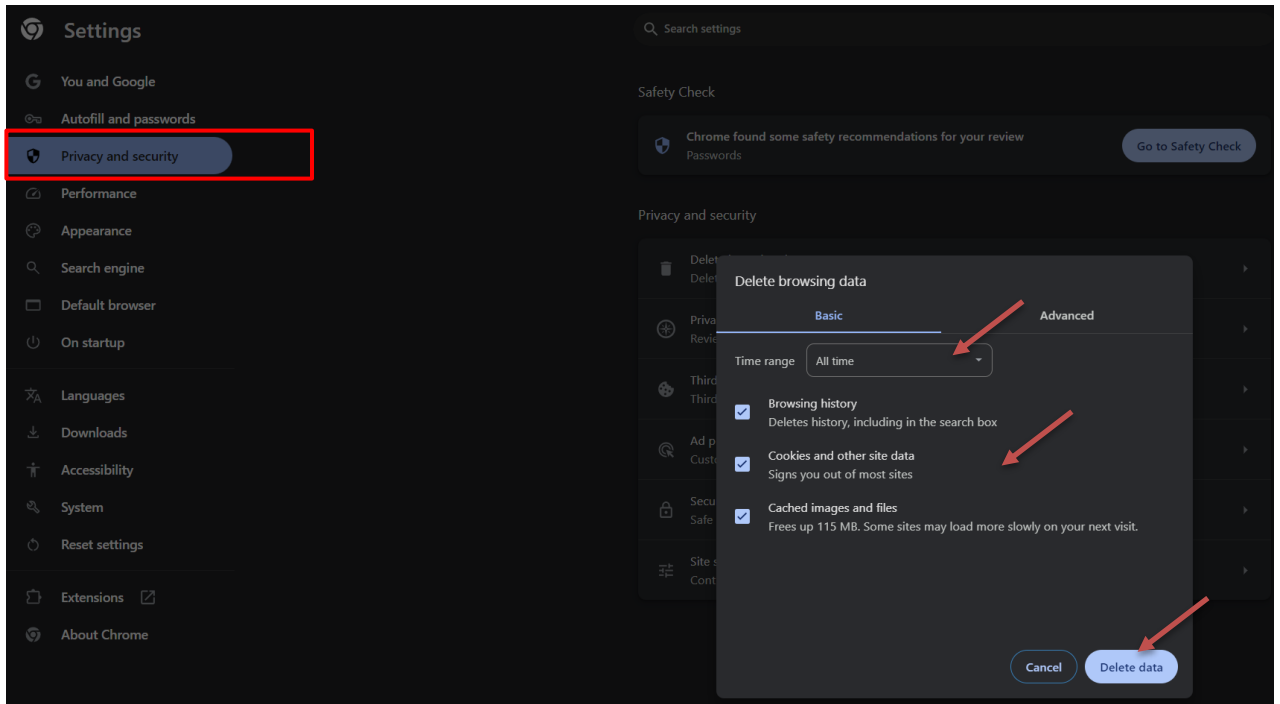


Chrome – Clear Cache

4. Under 'More Tools', select "Performance"

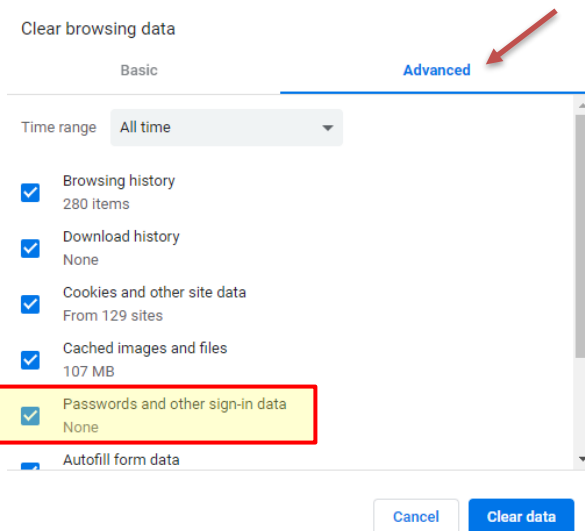


5. Under **'Privacy and Security'**, click **'Delete browsing data'**.
6. At the top, change the default Time range from **'Last hour'** to **'All time'**.
7. All three options should have a check mark (**'Browsing history'**, **'Cookies and other site data'** and **'Cached images and files'**)



8. Click **'Delete data'**.

Please be aware that if you've had a password reset, and you had your old password **set to 'remember'** on your device, you may want to clear your 'Passwords' as well. You will find that under the 'Advanced' tab. **Be cautious that you know all your passwords before you proceed with this step!**



Helpful Hint:

Regardless of the Internet Browser you are using, you can also hit 'Ctrl/Shift/Delete', and it will bring up the 'Delete Browsing History/Clear browsing data' window automatically.
