Student Advocacy Fee	C	\$4.50/semester	Provides provincial advocacy, mental health and food bank initiatives, and CSU executive leadership training through workshops and conferences.
Cornwall Student Union Events	C	\$20/semester	The events include family friendly days, themed weeks, pub nights, trivia nights, health and wellness, paint night, hockey games and many more for students. The fee will also support associated administrative and labour costs along with event prizes and security for events when deemed necessary.
