## **HOW TO GET YOUR STUDENTS STARTED WITH SPARKPATH:**

#### **Guide Your Students to the Platform:**

Direct your students to go to app.mysparkpath.com and click "Sign Up" or "Get Started."

#### **Student Account Creation:**

Instruct your students to create a student account using their SLC student e-mail address and the SLC code: **SLC2024** (Note: Test it out yourself by using your SLC email address and the SLC2024 code)

## **Sorting the Challenge Cards:**

Have your students follow the on-screen instructions to sort the Challenge Cards. Encourage them to think critically about each card and how it aligns with their interests and skills.

# **Reviewing the Challenge Profile:**

Once completed, ask your students to review their Challenge Profile (PDF), which will include their top three challenges and suggested activities to help them get involved with their selected challenges. You might want to schedule a class discussion or individual meetings to go over these profiles.

### **Facilitate Discussions:**

Encourage students to discuss their results with a friend, trusted mentor, or Career Advisor. Consider incorporating this step into classroom activities, such as peer review sessions, mentorship programs, or one-on-one consultations to discuss their next steps and how they can engage with their identified challenges.
