

He has also taught at many prestigious schools including the Etobicoke School of the Arts and is a faculty of SLC's MusicTheatre Performance program.

So You Want to Act: Auditioning 101 June 26-27, 9AM-4PM

Interested in the performing arts but don't know where to start? This two-day workshop is for performers of all levels with a focus on auditioning across a variety of settings (college/university program auditions, professional stage, film, TV, commercials). This workshop introduces you to auditioning considerations such as wardrobe decisions, preparations, agents, photos and resumes. Experience and participate in "mock auditions" in a supportive environment to develop a better understanding of what happens on both sides of the audition table. All levels welcome.

Gaetanne Lavoie



Gaetanne recently returned to Canada after living and creating in New York for over six years. A representational figure painter, Gaetanne received a BFA from York University in Toronto, an MFA from the Academy of Art University in San Francisco, and a second MFA from the New York Academy of Art in New York. In addition to her extensive exhibition

experience, Gaetanne has taught drawing and painting to artists of all levels and has worked on murals for cathedrals across the United States, painting the ceiling for the New York Public Library and sculpting the ceiling for Bergdorf Goodman in Manhattan. Gaetanne also has several publications to credit, the most recent from Voyage MIA magazine in Miami, FL. Her work can be found in several corporate and private collections.

Reflected Image to Finished Portrait July 22-25, 10AM-3PM

Focusing on the techniques of the Masters, participants are guided through painting self-portraits in oil or acrylic. Lecture and demonstration with particular focus on how to paint flesh, various painting techniques and other elements of art such as creating form, volume and dimension, light and shadow, perspective, foreshortening, anatomy, and composition and design is sure to enhance the skill of any experienced painter. Advancement from the Haliburton School of the Arts (2014). He has held numerous volunteer and paid positions at galleries and museums in Kingston, Toronto and Brockville. He has apprenticed with Shayne Dark, one of Canada's prominent sculptors based out of Kingston, Ontario.

His work is represented by Rothwell Gallery in Ottawa, Ontario, Applecrate Galleries in Manotick, Ontario, and Denison Gallery in Toronto, Ontario. His work is held in numerous private collections in Canada, the U.S., the U.K., and Australia, and has been exhibited across North America. His work has also been published in several magazines in Canada, and the U.S., as well as The Peace Project, a catalogue produced by Gallery 9 in Culver City, California in 2010.

No Brushes Allowed June 28-30, 10AM-2PM

Step out of your comfort zone and have some fun! This studio course focuses on non-objective abstract art using acrylic paint and unconventional tools such as spatulas, rulers, sticks, scrapers, and even hands and fingers! With the guidance of artist Fraser Radford, students will explore methods of painting used by the artists who rose to prominence in the latter half of the 20th Century. Suitable for artists of all experience levels looking to loosen up and expand their creativity.

Jeannette Froese LeBlanc lives in a little red school-house on the edge of a woods in rural Ontario with her husband, children and a menagerie of pets. She walks the fine line between making a life and making a living; balancing the creative passions of an artist with the responsibilities of everyday life. Jeannette is a former infantry soldier and

magazine publisher. She holds a Master's degree in education as well as bachelor's degrees in history and art. When she is not teaching, Jeannette is inspired by nature and Canadian history, creating in her home studio. She began to explore Canadian architecture in ceramics while living in Quebec. Several pieces where purchased from galleries in Ottawa, including one that was gifted by the Canadian Government to Prince Edward when he married Sophie Rhys-Jones. Currently Jeannette is recreating tiny versions of historic Canadian buildings in silver in a new line of jewellery using metal clay.

Funky Town: Handbuilding Whimsical Tea Light Holders and Sculptures July 24, 9AM-4PM

Get funky in the ceramic studio in this handbuilding workshop where participants will work with ceramic artist Jeannette Froese LeBlanc to create funky house tea light holders/sculptures. Projects will be completed to the bisque fire state. This workshop pairs well with our glazing workshops. No experience necessary.

A love of beautiful books inspired Larry Thompson to print with hand-set lead type and a vintage proofing press. He is a letterpress printer, writer, and former editor of The Upper Canadian, an antiques trade magazine. As proprietor of Greyweathers Press, he has printed various artists' books and linoleum and wood engraving prints too numerous to count. When he is not creating beautiful prints, Larry is also a Professor, currently faculty of both St. Lawrence College and Carleton University.

Landscape in Print July 15-16, 9AM-4PM

Discover the endless possibilities of linocut and explore the beauty of the Canadian Landscape through printmaking. Learn the basics of creating clean and impactful linocut prints as artist and Professor Larry Thompson walks you through the planning, design, carving and printing of your landscape design. Some drawing experience recommended but not required. Beginner.

Lisa Free



Lisa Free is a Canadian artist known for her loosely rendered sparkling waterscapes and elegant tonal interiors. Free's work is rooted in her strong connection with the 1000 Islands region of Canada, drawing inspiration from the shimmering St. Lawrence River, windswept island pines, and historic castle interiors. Free works with an intuitive colour palette and gestural paint application, attempting to convey her subject with minimal strokes. The resulting paintings portray the

essence of her subjects while radiating warmth and familiarity. Following a 15-year career in theatrical costume design and work as a commercial textile artist, Free turned her focus to painting full-time, and quickly gained a following of dedicated collectors. Lisa has exhibited in established exhibitions and galleries since 2010, and her work is collected in Canada, the United States, and Europe.

Moody Interiors in Oils & Acrylics July 5-7, 9AM-4PM

Explore capturing light and shadow to create mood and atmosphere in your interior still-life works. Through lecture and demonstration, artist Lisa Free will guide you to creating your own "moody interior". Basics of composition and design will be addressed as you work your way from reference image to finished painting under the guidance and support of artist Lisa Free. This course is suitable for artists working in acrylics or oils with previous painting experience.

Winter Shadows in Oils & Acrylics July 27-29, 9AM-4PM

Take a break from the summer heat with this winter landscape workshop! You will be supported through the creative process from basic elements of design to capturing long shadows and selecting a palette typical of winter months. This course is suitable for artists working in acrylics or oils with previous painting experience.

MiSun was born and grew up in Korea. She took Pottery and Metal Arts at InDuk College. Her first major job was as an assistant director for Seoul Movie and Cinepoem production companies. Afterwards she worked as an illustrator in Angenara, an illustration company in Korea. She moved to Canada in 2003 and since then she has been developing

her career as an artist. MiSun is a Professor of watercolour and ceramics for St. Lawrence College, teaching in full-time and part-time programs. With many art exhibitions throughout Ontario, MiSun spends her summers exhibiting her artwork and teaching in the 1000 Islands Summer School of the Arts.

The highlight of this course is designing your pottery using multi-coloured clay. All levels are welcome in this creative and inspiring class!

Glazing Workshop July 31, 10AM-12PM

Using your previously bisque-fired works, learn glazing basics to complete your projects. Perfect for those who have taken earlier courses and workshops or if you have any bisque works that you want to "finish". All levels welcome.

Tea for Two: Handbuilding Tea Sets July 10-11, 10AM-3PM

Join us in our ceramic studio for this fun and inspirational handbuilding workshop. Perfect for both new and established potters, participants will explore techniques for creating whimsical tea pots and mugs using basic handbuilding and surface texture techniques. Works will be prepared to the point of bisque firing. This workshop pairs well with our glazing workshops. All levels welcome.
