WAYS TO LEARN AT SLC

St. Lawrence College is pleased to offer flexible learning opportunities that allow you to customize your learning experience. Courses and programs are designed to promote personal and professional growth and training needs. Use this guide to find courses that best suit your interests and daily schedule.

On Campus

Continuing Education classes will not be held on the campuses in Winter 2021. See Alternate Delivery.

Instructor-led Virtual Classroom (Alternate Delivery)

This is a delivery model that uses a mix of online and in-person online instruction. Synchronous (in-person online) instruction allows for the instructor and student to engage simultaneously (online) using the video conferencing tool Microsoft Teams during a scheduled time. Other resources, activities and assignments are available in Blackboard, for student use throughout the duration of the course.

Technology requirements: You will need a computer or tablet with a camera, mic and high speed internet access.

SLC will provide you with a student account and access to the student portal slc.me, where you will access your course and learning materials, Blackboard and Microsoft Teams.

Online

Online learning offers great flexibility as the weekly activities can be completed anytime during the week prior to a deadline. Instructors will provide students with support and guidance during the course so that they may achieve their goals. All online courses are credited and can be used as part of a variety of certificates and diplomas. Some courses also have monthly intakes which enables students to start mid-way through a term.

COURSE OFFERINGS

Course offerings are available to those who wish to upgrade skills, develop their professional portfolio, engage in personal development or just for fun, whether they are for non-credit or credit. Some admission requirements may apply.

Non-credit Courses

ARTS

Let Colour Be Free on Silhouettes M. Kim-Hunter

This is a painting technique that can create a free style of drawing with colour. We are going to capture the rhythm of light and shadows from visible objects and make a loose colourful watercolour painting. Basic drawing techniques and making colour palette tips will be introduced to complete the work.

Writing Genre Fiction G. Strathy

Learn the secrets of writing stories in popular fiction genres such as: Crime/Mystery, Romance, Fantasy, Science Fiction, Horror, Adventure, Thriller, Suspense, or Western. Using examples, you will discover the classic structure and traits of major genres (chosen by the class) as a jumping off point for your own work. You'll have opportunities to develop ideas, write flash fiction/short stories, and create outlines for full-length works.

Let it Flow K. Richter

The diversity of watercolour makes it the perfect medium for quick sketches, vignettes or serious studio painting. This course will cover all the aspects of painting in this medium, from reference photography to different painting techniques, composition and design to colour choices and theory. Karin welcomes all levels of painters eager to explore, improve, and perfect their craft. Through demonstrations, talks, and constructive critiques, Karin will help participants reach their creative potential.

Murder, They Wrote P. Whiting

In this course, we will read four unconventional murder novels, unconventional for a variety of reasons that have to do with authors, protagonists, and plots. The classes will consist of lectures on the novels, with time for discussion. Feb. 2 – *A Rage in Harlem* by Chester Himes (Penguin Classic); Feb. 9 – *Beast in View* by Margaret Millar (Phoenix); Feb. 16 – *Motherless Brooklyn* by Jonathan Lethem (Vintage); Feb. 23 – *Chronicle of a Death Foretold* by Gabriel García Márquez (Vintage). No Brushes Allowed F. Radford

This course focuses on methods of painting used by artists in the latter half of the 20th Century/early 21st Century. Using unconventional tools like spatulas, rulers, sticks, scrapers, old cards, you will learn how to create a painting without having to touch a traditional brush! This is an acrylics based course. Be prepared to possibly get out of your comfort zone, and have fun!

Watercolour Painting on Rice Paper M. Kim-Hunter

Rice paper is a thin and absorbent and also known as Asian painting paper. The paper absorbs the water allowing colors blend. A lot can be done with one brush stroke. It's a good exercise to practice brush techniques for watercolour and make beautiful art at the same time. You don't need much space or supplies to work. It's a simple and satisfying way to enjoy your time.

Watercolor Basics - Drawing and Watercolour M. Kim-Hunter

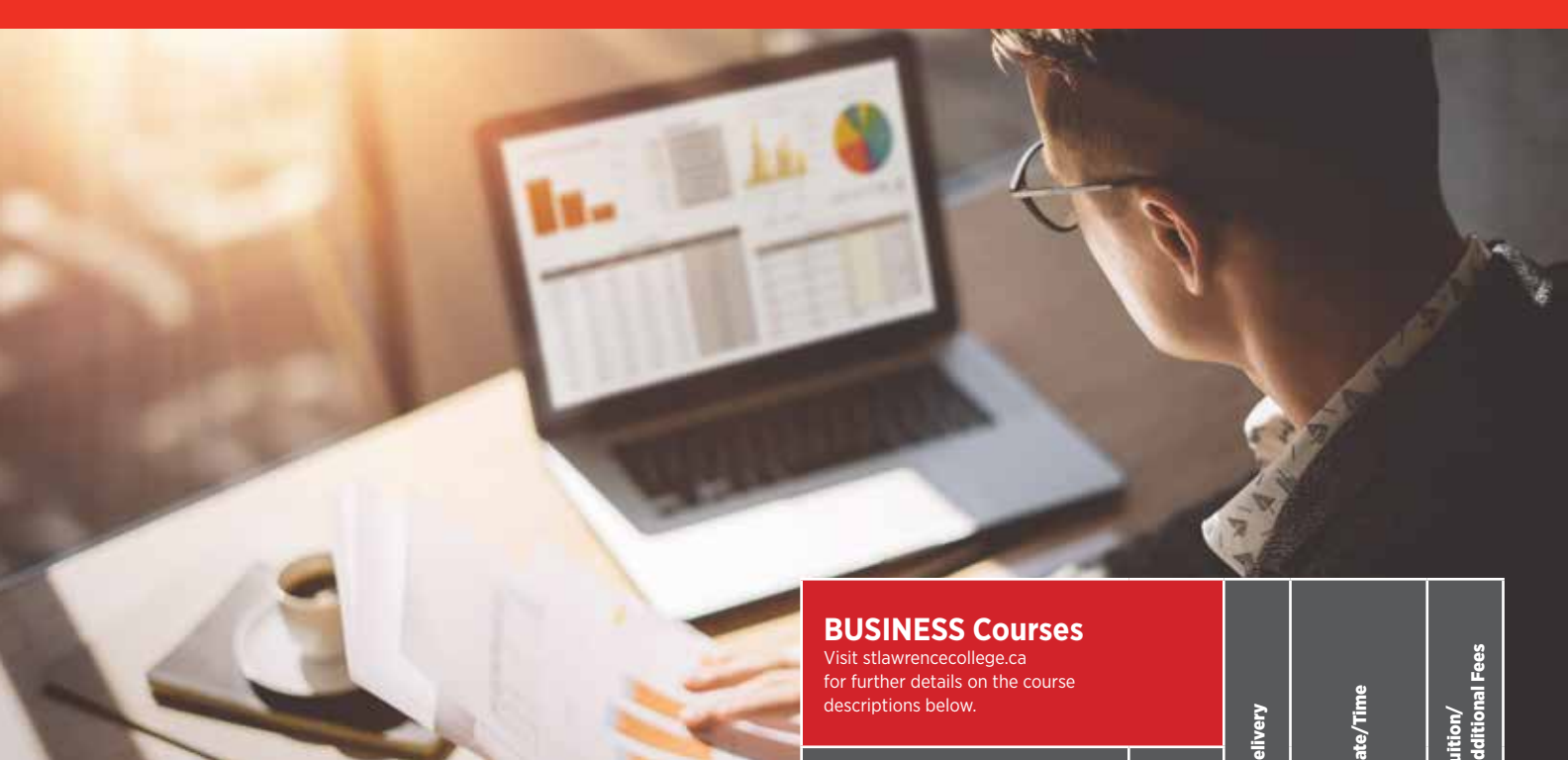
Watercolour uses white paper and clean water to show white or bright instead of white paint. That means understanding the light value before you jump into the painting is very important. This course will focus on how the sketch works in watercolour with step-by-step demonstrations and student practice. Also, we are going to explore how to make art by using pen lines in watercolour. This will be a nice technique to learn for 'plein air' drawing.

Introduction to Beekeeping 1 E. & J. Espadero

Beekeeping is a rewarding and worthwhile endeavour. This course provides participants with both the theoretical and practical knowledge necessary to be a successful beekeeper. Topics includes an introduction to honey bee biology, beekeeping equipment, organic and conventional management options, beekeeping responsibilities through the year, diagnosing queen issues, overwintering, Ontario bee regulations, and honey extraction. Particular emphasis will be placed on honey bee pests and diseases, and their corresponding treatments. This course is a prerequisite for Introduction to Beekeeping 2: A Day at the Beeyard.

Introduction to Beekeeping 2: A Day at the Beeyard E. & J. Espadero

This hands-on course will take place in a beeyard, focusing on scenarios encountered throughout the beekeeping season. Participants complete a full hive inspection. Learn proper smoker use, varroa mite testing, feeding, winter wrap options, queen handling, and other techniques for successful beekeeping. Prerequisite: Introduction to Beekeeping 1 or equivalent.



BUSINESS

Business Intelligence Applications

This course introduces students to various business analytics visualization tools employed by business analytics professionals. Students use these applications to visualize and manipulate different data sets. They also build descriptive and predictive models using these applications, with the goal of presenting the outputs and results to management and senior leadership within an organization.

Marketing 1

Marketing 1 is the first course of a two-course Introduction to Marketing designed to provide students with a sound grounding in the field of marketing. Emphasis is placed on the formulation of integrated marketing strategies that play a role in achieving organizational objectives. The course is divided into four segments: marketing process and marketing environments; marketing planning and information collection processes; buyer behaviour and targeting strategies; and marketing mix (two components of the mix are discussed: product and price).

Project Life Cycle Management and Communications

This course introduces students to the project management of analytics-based initiatives. At the core of this course are project management disciplines as it pertains to initiating, planning, executing, controlling, and closing the analytics project work of a team to achieve specific goals. This course emphasizes a team-based approach to managing analytics projects, and, effectively communicating results to stakeholders. Students are introduced to the Life Cycle of an analytics project and, how to effectively manage analytics projects.

Social Media Marketing

Social media now plays an important role in any company's marketing strategy. In this course you will be provided with a fundamental understanding of many of the different social media channels including the use of mobile apps and games for social media marketing. Once an understanding of the social media channels is established you will learn how to leverage the channels to engage audiences, and integrate with traditional media, in order to achieve marketing objectives.

Through General Education, students become more conscious of the diversity, complexity, and richness of the human experience, and as a result, are better able to contribute thoughtfully, creatively, and positively to their communities.

Disclaimer: Students wishing to register for a General Education course as part of their full-time certificate or diploma must receive formal approval from their Program Coordinator before registration. Some General Education courses are too close to the vocational specializations of specific programs and are therefore excluded as an option for students.

The World of Astronomy

Astronomy is the study of all which is beyond the Earth. This course examines the visible features of the sky: the Moon, the Sun, planets, stars, constellations, meteors and galaxies. Students learn how to “navigate across the night sky” by moving from constellation to constellation in a logical and progressive manner. In addition, students examine the content of key constellations in detail and develop skills in analyzing and explaining unique astronomical phenomena.

HEALTH CARE

Communication Strategies A. Graham

Effective communication is essential to the provision of quality care. This course focuses on relevant theories, techniques and application in dementia care. Emphasis is on the utilization of best strategies in communicating with persons with dementia. Communication in a team setting as well as with family members is also explored.

Overview of Dementia Care A. Evans

In an aging society, an understanding of dementia is becoming increasingly critical for families and caregivers. In this course, normal aging versus dementia is discussed including symptoms, reasons for behaviours, and best practice care principles. Topics include brain and brain changes and their effects on communication and care strategies as well as legal and ethical implications. This course is the prerequisite for all other Dementia Studies Statement of Achievement courses.

Enhanced Care Strategies A. Evans

Persons with dementia deserve quality of life and quality of care. In this course the principle of enhanced care is examined and applied from diagnosis to end of life in a variety of settings. Topics include team approach, tips and tools, grief, family and caregiver stress and self-care strategies.

LANGUAGES

French Language Certificate

This program is designed for students, who have little or no knowledge of French, to reach a level of oral expression and comprehension that enables them to converse in everyday and professional situations. Emphasis is placed on interpersonal communication. Grammar and vocabulary progress from simple sentences and words to being more complex and varied. Reading and writing are part of the program as these are fundamental language skills. Students learn through a variety of engaging and interactive activities that build confidence in communicating in French.

These courses are currently offered in the instructor-led virtual classroom (Alternate Delivery).
