TEAM-TAUGHT DUAL CREDIT PROGRAM:

Students are enrolled in a course that has significant overlap between a secondary curriculum course and a college curriculum course. A college instructor delivers the portion of the course from the college curriculum, and a secondary school teacher delivers the portion contained in the Ontario curriculum course at the high school.

COLLEGE COURSE DESCRIPTION:

CARP 24 – Introduction to Carpentry (45 hours)

This course provides instruction of construction safety, layout techniques, and proper hand and power tool use, to produce several carpentry projects. At the end of this course, students will be able to apply safety legislation for construction projects contained in the occupational Health and Safety Act of Ontario, specifically towards the use of personal protective devices, and the safe use of hand and portable power tools. Read simple blueprints; follow oral and written instructions for the construction of specified projects. Demonstrate an ability to use basic numerical functions to solve for workplace math-related problems, successfully calculate rough stud openings for exterior doors and windows and practice framing sequences, and develop knowledge and skill in the drawing and sketching of plans, to create accurately scaled drawings.

EVALUATION:

Students will be evaluated by the college instructor for the college course and by the high school teacher for the high school course. The courses are evaluated separately and therefore students can receive two different marks.
