SWAC: SCHOOL WITHIN A COLLEGE DUAL CREDIT PROGRAM:

Students will have the opportunity to earn high school credits and a college Dual Credit. Students will be taught by a LDSB teacher for their high school courses, and a college teacher for their Dual Credit.

CAMPUS: Kingston

SEATS: 20 students from LDSB local high schools will participate

DURATION: Dual Credit – from September 13th to December 17th (14 weeks)
High School Courses – from September to January (6-8 week blocks)

DUAL CREDIT EARNED:

Students have a choice between three Dual Credits:

ESTH 43: Make-Up (60 hours)

- 1 SECONDARY SCHOOL MINISTRY DUAL CREDIT – CODE: **TXI4T**
- 1 COLLEGE CREDIT – CODE: **ESTH 43**
- SCHEDULE: TBA

This course teaches students the theory and practical for makeup application. Topics include: definitions, morphology, facial shapes and balance, color classifications, observations and factors to consider prior to make-up application, proper steps and techniques involved in makeup application, supplies brushes and products used. Students will also be taught to create a variety of make-up styles suitable for day, evening, bridal and special events. *Related Program: Esthetics*

GENE 20: Developmental Psychology (45 hours)

- 1 SECONDARY SCHOOL MINISTRY DUAL CREDIT – CODE: **JFA4T**
- 1 COLLEGE CREDIT – CODE: **GENE 20**
- SCHEDULE: TBA

This course presents an overview of the scientific study of human development from conception to death. The most recent research findings on physical, social and cognitive development are studied and discussed. *Related Program: This course can be used as the General Elective (GENE) requirement in many programs at St. Lawrence College*

POFP 106: Principles of Ethical Reasoning – Police Foundations (45 hours)

- 1 SECONDARY SCHOOL MINISTRY DUAL CREDIT – CODE: **HED4T**
- 1 COLLEGE CREDIT – CODE: **POFP 106**
- SCHEDULE: TBA

This course focuses ethical issues faced by individuals as citizens and professionals. It helps students to clarify their values and establish a framework for ethical decision making. Ethical issues which relate to a wide variety of concerns are examined. Students will examine a variety of professional ethical codes and apply ethical decision making models to dilemmas in their personal and professional lives. *Related Program: Police Foundations*

HIGH SCHOOL CREDITS EARNED:

- Students will earn an English Credit (ENG4C) and a Math Credit (MBF3C or MAP4C)
- High school English and math credits will be taught in 6-8 week blocks
- Students will take part in a Co-op placement (this will run throughout the semester)
