COURSE DESCRIPTION:

GENE 175 - A HISTORY OF INDIGENOUS PEOPLES (42 hours)

This course examines the history of Indigenous Peoples in the land we now call Canada, from pre-contact to modern times. Students will learn about the diversity among Indigenous Peoples, their world views, and the importance of land and sustenance. They will also discover the ways of living that emerged as a result of geography, and the changes in these ways of living that were brought about by European contact and subsequent colonization processes. Students will briefly explore the current circumstances of Indigenous People in Canada in the context of the historical events that shaped and continue to shape their lives.

*This course can be used as a General Elective (GENE) required in many programs at St. Lawrence College
