Updates from Aboriginal Services</li> <li>In August, Brockville Campus' Eagle Learning Café opened.</li> <li>All campuses have been offering craft sessions though concerns were noted regarding attendance at the Cornwall sessions. It was suggested the craft sessions not be limited to a specific timeframe in the day to allow for more participation.</li> <li>The deadline for applications for Indigenous Student Bursaries has passed. Decisions will be made by a selection committee and the 15 bursaries will be awarded in January. There were 55 applications for the 15 bursaries.</li> <li>The Eagle Learning Centre in Cornwall has a field placement student from the SSW program working with Shirley for the fall semester. There will be a potluck in December. Shirley is offering various activities to engage students but is having difficulty getting participation. Workload issues were cited as the main hindrance.</li> <li>2. TIF Funding</li> <li>TIF funding was used to fund Kickstart to College.</li> <li>3. September Enrolment</li> <li>The enrolment numbers have been fairly consistent with some programs oversubscribed.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>The biggest boost has been in International students.</li> <li>It was suggested there were 320 Aboriginal students tri-campus in 2015-2016 but it is believed that number is low as it relies on self-identification.
