St. Lawrence College

Delivering Solutions for the Double Cohort

In preparation for the arrival of the "double cohort" in Fall 2003, St. Lawrence College has developed a draft strategy to ensure all qualified students have access to a post-secondary education.

The cornerstone of this strategy is the \$26 million Kingston campus expansion project that is expected to create almost 1100 new student spaces upon completion in the summer of 2003. Expanded library and food services areas, new classrooms and labs, and a trades training facility are all part of this major redevelopment plan to ensure the campus is prepared for the anticipated growth in enrolment. Two new projects have also recently been added to the expansion plans: a new wing in the student residence and a new sports field development along Portsmouth Avenue.

St. Lawrence is also finalizing the details of a new February intake for a range of academic programs beginning in February 2003. This initiative is primarily designed to allow secondary school students to complete their diploma requirements in the fall semester and begin a college diploma program immediately. Students enrolling

in February intake programs complete the entire first year by July, allowing them to enroll in second year in the fall. Current plans are to launch a February intake in eight programs: Electronics Engineering Technician, Computer Automation and Control Technician, Computer Automation and Control Technologist, Computer Networking and Technical Support (2 year diploma), Computer Programmer Analyst (3 year diploma), Business/Business Administration - General, Office Administration - General, and Personal Support Worker.

St. Lawrence is the starting point for many students seeking a university degree through credit transfer and articulation agreements with many universities. The most recent is with the State University of New York at Potsdam, an agreement that provides St. Lawrence College graduates in five different programs with up to two years credit towards a degree program at SUNY Potsdam. Other successful university articulation agreements have been developed in various programs with Queen's University, Laurentian University, Athabaska University and Lakehead University.

The College has submitted a proposal to be among the first colleges deliver an Applied Degree program Bachelor of Applied Arts (Human Services, Behavioural Sciences), building upon an existing 'centre of excellence' in our academic programming.

St. Lawrence College will provide accessibility to post-secondary education by increasing capacity at each of our Brockville, Cornwall and Kingston campuses. However, this commitment to providing access to a quality education in the communities we serve will be increasingly difficult given the provincial government's continued underfunding of the college system. Ontario colleges currently receive the lowest per-student funding in Canada, having endured a decade in which the provincial operating grant has been decreased by over 15% while the total enrolment has increased by 34%. Accommodating both the "double cohort" and the enrolment increase generated by shifting demographic trends combined with inadequate government funding presents an issue critical to post-secondary education in the future.





St. Lawrence College is the Leader in Provincial Survey Results

The results of comprehensive provincial accountability surveys released this morning by the Association of Colleges of Applied Arts and Technology (ACAATO) indicate that St. Lawrence College is the provincial leader in delivering quality academic programs and meeting customer demands.

St. Lawrence College highlights of the Key Performance Indicator (KPI) results include a Graduate Employment Rate of 92.8%, over 4% higher than the provincial average. St. Lawrence also achieved very high customer satisfaction levels with an Employer Satisfaction Rate of over 95% and a Graduate Satisfaction Rate of almost 85%, both results exceeding provincial averages

by over 3%. "We are extremely pleased with these results that show we are achieving our primary goals of student and graduate success," said Volker Thomsen, President and CEO.

"One of our key messages has been that 'Our Grads Get Jobs' and these survey results confirm not only that St. Lawrence graduates are very successful in gaining employment, but also their employers are very satisfied with the knowledge and skills they possess," said Glenn Vollebregt, Senior Vice-President, Advancement and Corporate Services.

The KPI project is a collaborative effort between the provincial government and Ontario's 25 colleges of ap-

plied arts and technology designed to highlight performance and accountability. Results from the above three KPI measures are used as a basis for performance-based provincial funding.

The results of the provincial Student Satisfaction survey were also released, with St. Lawrence receiving an overall satisfaction level of almost 73%, an increase of over 2% from last year.

"These results are good news to students planning on attending St. Lawrence College this fall," added Vollebregt. "St. Lawrence College delivers a quality education at home in our own communities."

Partnership Bonds SUNY Canton and Ontario's St. Lawrence College

The State University of New York Canton and St. Lawrence College signed a partnership agreement recently to bring two- and three-year graduates of the Canadian college to SUNY Canton to complete a four-year degree.

The agreement also provides for faculty exchanges and cooperation in distance-learning initiatives.

"The graduates of St. Lawrence College are ideally prepared to thrive in our four-year degree programs," said Joseph Kennedy, President of SUNY Canton. "Both of our institutions have particular strengths in technology-based majors and have students and staff who will benefit from the international ties that this agreement will create."

St. Lawrence College (SLC) has campuses in Brockville, Cornwall and Kingston that serve approximately 5,000 full-time students. SLC also serves about 20,000 part-time students in on-campus, on-line, correspondence and contract training courses each year.

The agreement was signed by Kennedy and SLC President Volker



Thomsen following a campus tour and luncheon in April, attended by key administrators from both institutions. That visit followed a similar one in March by SUNY Canton representatives to the Brockville campus.

The agreement focuses on transfers of SLC students into SUNY Canton's baccalaureate degrees in Information Technology, Criminal Investigation, and Health Services Manage-

ment, and pending degrees in Financial Services Management, and Facilities Operation.

Thomsen noted that the relationship will help attract qualified students to both SLC and SUNY Canton, and will facilitate upward educational career mobility for students by increasing baccalaureate education for qualified individuals.



Residence Addition and New Sports Field for Kingston Campus

The Kingston Campus of St. Lawrence College will add two new projects to its current expansion plans. The student residence will make space available for additional students, while a new sports field will be developed along Portsmouth Avenue.

"Our current residence was opened in 1997 and has been a great success," says Chris Whitaker, Campus Director. "The additional space will help to address the demand we have for 'on-campus' living space."

Residence construction will begin in the spring, adding an additional 100 student rooms to the current student residence structure. The expanded facility will be ready for the arrival of students in the fall of 2003. The design team will include local architectural firm Shoalts & Zaback and consulting engineers, J.L. Richards & Associates. The cost of construction is projected to be \$4 million.

The new 'home field' will be available for both college and community athletes. "St. Lawrence has a number of competitive sports teams, including

some provincial champions," says Diana Drury, Athletic Director/Student Life Coordinator. "Until now, our home field, for varsity level teams have been scattered throughout the city. This facility will also serve to support academic programs which have an athletics component."

The first phase of the field development project is expected to cost \$200,000. The field will be completed this fall.

On November 1, 2001, a groundbreaking event was held for the campus 'Expanding Opportunities' project. Expanded library and food services areas, classrooms, labs and trades training facility are all part of a major redevelopment plan to ensure the campus is prepared for an anticipated growth in enrolment.

"Our goal is to expand opportunities for our students to be successful," states Whitaker. "Student residence and athletics are important components of student life, which we are pleased to be developing through this initiative."

The full cost of the redevelopment project is expected to be \$26 million.

St. Lawrence Nominated for Kingston Technology Council Award

St. Lawrence College's professors David Aythersych, Colin Banger, Jack Cooper, and Trevor Rainey received a nomination for the Kingston Technology Council Partnership Award. The four Computer Engineering Technology (Software Developer) professors, with their excellent mix of teaching and industrial experience in software, mathematics and telecommunications, received the nomination as designers of a final year software development project for eSponsive, a local high tech firm.

eSponsive is a marketing concept that allows the partnering of the College with companies who, in turn, provide projects which give students experience in the latest software tools. The ideal arrangement is for the company to hire a student for the summer. The student then brings back a project to the college and forms a team with four or five other students. They implement

the project over the fall and winter semesters under the supervision of both college faculty and the company designer. Ideally, at the end of the project, the company would hire the graduates, feeling very confident in their abilities to meet the needs of the company with minimal training.

eSponsive provides software to banks, which allows customers to do inter-web banking. It also allows them to customize the bank's web page with icons and features - which seems to be what customers want. This technology fundamentally changes the way in which people get their information, as well as making it a much more personal experience for them.

Andrew Smith, eSponsive Vice-President of Research and Development and Chair of the Advisory Committee, stated that "summer students were productive within the first two weeks of hiring." As a member of the

advisory committee, Smith is in the ideal position to provide feedback about the quality of the summer students and graduates coming out of this program. Graduates were hired from the 1998 and 2000 classes.

The Partner Award is presented annually to a strategic partner or service provider that has, over the last twelve months, made a significant contribution to a Kingston company, enabling it to grow at an accelerated rate and/or make a major impact in a national or international market.

Other nominees for the Partner Award were: Bell Canada, Canadian Microelectronics Corporation, Kingston General Hospital, PARTEQ Innovations Inc & Stantive Solutions Inc. The Awards of Technology Council's Excellence Ceremony took place on February 2, 2002 at the Ambassador Convention Centre in Kingston.

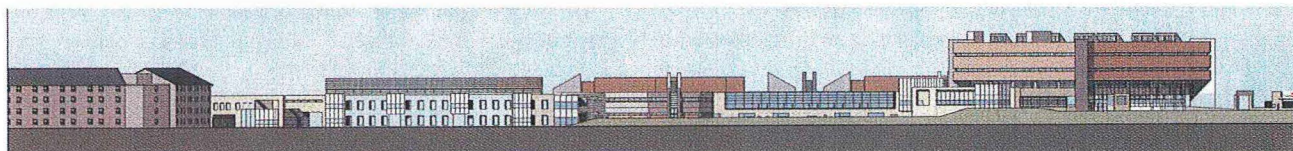
Innovation Award:

Kingston Expansion Project Well Underway

The \$26 million expansion project at the Kingston Campus is proceeding on schedule. The \$1.4 million renovation of the Veterinary Technology Laboratories was completed last summer and this year's students have given the new facility rave reviews.

Contracts for a high voltage transformer substation and the new School of Business building have been awarded at \$1 and \$11 million respectively and construction has started. The School of Business building will form a link between the two academic buildings already on campus. The contractor on the School of Business building is R.E. Hein from Kanata.

The design team expects to tender for the balance of the work late this spring. That will include a renovation to the current student center, an expansion

and renovation of the library and an expansion to the seating area of the cafeteria. John MacGregor, who graduated from the Civil program on our Cornwall Campus, has joined the design team and is the College's representative on site. John is a long-term employee of the College. He will relocate from the Cornwall to the Kingston Campus to take on his new assignment.

In December the Board of Governors approved a \$4 million expansion to the student residence at the Kingston Campus. The facility will consist of 100 single rooms and will extend east of the current facility. The design of that project is well underway and construction will start this summer. Bill Peairs another long-term employee of the College will represent the College during the design

and construction of the residence facility.

The construction of a new sports field was partially completed before the winter freeze-up. It will be completed this spring and will be home to our varsity teams this fall - the best playing field in Kingston. The construction will cost \$200,000 and the work is being completed by Limestone Construction.

The next eighteen months will be very busy on campus as all this work will be completed for occupancy by September 2003. Blayne Mackey, who is heading up the work for the College, says, "Sidewalk supervision is encouraged, so please feel free to drop by the campus for a visit and take a look at the construction sites."



Student Success Project Paying Off at SLC

St. Lawrence has made student retention a priority by making it one of the strategic directions for the College.

Presently, St. Lawrence College has a retention rate of approximately 66 %. Only 2/3 of our students who begin their studies with us graduate; 1/3 do not. The effect of this is felt in the College and in the community, as this 1/3 have not had their expectations met, and leave the College with a negative experience to report to their friends, neighbours and families.

After researching the literature and tracking students who had left the College, there were four consistent reasons why students left school:

1. Lack of financial support.
2. Academic underpreparedness.
3. Wrong program choice.
4. No connection to the College community.

Students who do not have the necessary financial support either leave school to take a job, or try to combine work with school and fail to find the balance.

Students who do not have the necessary academic foundational courses cannot succeed in their College entry courses and tend to leave very early in the first semester.

Some students simply have chosen the wrong course and are forced to

leave the College as a result. Some of these students return in the next year, but for many a whole academic term has been lost.

The fourth reason students do not stay in College is very complex. Students need to feel part of the larger college community. They need to feel connected. They also need to have made social connections early. If a student feels isolated and has no one to turn to, this feeling of isolation becomes a barrier to his or her social and academic development.

Strategies to overcome these barriers became part of an activity plan that was developed in July, 2001. In September, 2001, 16 programs became part of a pilot project to activate these strategies and evaluate their effectiveness.

An enhanced tutorial program, a writing center, and social events between faculty and students began. A series of workshops were offered to faculty on best teaching practices, which foster a positive learning climate in the College. Programs met and reviewed the curriculum to ensure there was a balance in the students' course loads as they moved through their programs. Guest speakers and field trips were arranged to ensure students got a look at the job market, and became aware of

the opportunities afforded them in the marketplace.

In October, the Kingston campus opened a Writing Center to help students improve their writing skills. The Center is part of the Student Success Project. Brockville campus also opened a Writing Center last fall. Early reports from both students and teachers indicated that both of these Centers were helping students who would otherwise be at risk, and they saw an immediate improvement in their written communications skills.

In November, an interim report was tabled and the outlook for these strategies was positive. Early reports indicated these strategies were working!

Early indications from the interim reports are encouraging. The strategies used for this project have produced an increase in the number of students staying in their programs. The overall benefit of this increased retention rate will be felt by the College immediately as more students have shown their satisfaction with their experience at St. Lawrence. These students become our best ambassadors in our communities and will be an invaluable resource as alumni for our recruitment and enrolment challenges over the next few years!

Premier's Awards - Call for Nominations

What exactly are the Premier's Awards?

The Premier's Award is the highest honour that St. Lawrence College can bestow upon one of its graduates. It is an annual provincial awards program created by the government to acknowledge the important economic and social contribution college graduates make to Ontario.

Any graduate of a college program may be nominated, but the individual must have demonstrated outstanding career success and be making a contribution to his/her community or society. All suggestions will be re-

viewed by an internal selection committee and the College will forward one official nomination for each category to the Premier's Office

What are the various Categories?

Colleges may nominate one graduate in each of the following categories:

1. Applied Arts: Creative Arts and Design
2. Applied Arts: Community Services
3. Business
4. Health Sciences
5. Technology
6. Recent Graduate

How do I Nominate Someone?

Nominations should be sent to the Alumni Office, with a cover letter by the person making the nomination including the nominee's program and year of graduation, as well as the nominee's resume or CV, and copies of any media clippings or awards.

What is the Deadline for Nominations?

The Alumni Office welcomes suggestions for nominations at any time; however, the deadline for each particular year is Labour Day.



St. Lawrence College Hosts First Behavioural Science Technology Conference

On April 4th and 5th, the Donald Gordon Centre at Queen's University, was the locale for the first Behavioural Science Technology conference, entitled: Real World Challenges and Success Strategies for Behaviourists. All of the 24 speakers and 12 poster presenters were graduates of this unique program!

The Behavioural Science Technology program at St. Lawrence College, Kingston, is the only post-secondary program of its kind in Canada. Since 1973, this program has been training the next generation of front-line staff in human service settings to work in areas

such as Acquired Brain Injury, Addictions, Autism, Developmental Disabilities, Forensic, Job Training, Mental Health, and Schools.

The day-long session on April 5th began with an Invited Address by Gerry Bernicky, a BST graduate. He is the current President of ONTABA, which is the only provincial affiliate chapter of ABA, the Association for Behavior Analysis. Gerry Bernicky is a supervisor with the Toronto Preschool Autism Service, at Surrey Place Centre.

to the Business Administration, Marketing program at St. Lawrence College.

"I loved it at St. Lawrence," she says. Wiley particularly enjoyed instructors like Brad Hill, Bill Crowe and Danielle Burke. "It wasn't just a textbook education," she says. "All three of them rarely used textbooks. They brought their real life experience to the classroom and they instilled a high standard in us."

It's a standard that has served Wiley well ever since. Upon graduation, she took a job as Promotion Director at GTO 960/Country 96 Radio in Kingston. Within a couple of years she was at Downtown Kingston, covering Langlois' maternity leave. Although it

started out as a contract engagement, she's been there ever since.

Today Wiley's job has expanded to include the Downtown Development portfolio, which involves consulting with businesses and property owners to attract and retain merchants in the downtown core. "We've got a great mix of businesses right now," she says. "My job is to make sure we keep it."

Wiley credits her success to her St. Lawrence education. "The things I learned there are things I'm able to apply every day," she says. "All the courses stressed communication skills, both written and verbal. They're put to the test every minute of the day."

Once Wiley was on board, she and Langlois were able to spell each other on maternity leaves as they each took

time out to have two children. And as their families were growing, the Downtown Kingston family continued to grow, too. In 1999, it added yet another St. Lawrence alumnus, Heidi Staddon.

Originally from Brighton, Staddon moved to Kingston with her family in 1990. After high school, she earned a BA in Psychology from Queen's University. But she realized that her education was far from over. "I knew I wanted to be in business," she says. "I wanted to learn the practical applications, and St. Lawrence was an easy decision for me. It has a great reputation for marketing. I knew it was where I wanted to be."

Staddon was able to fast-track her education, studying through the summers to finish the three-year program

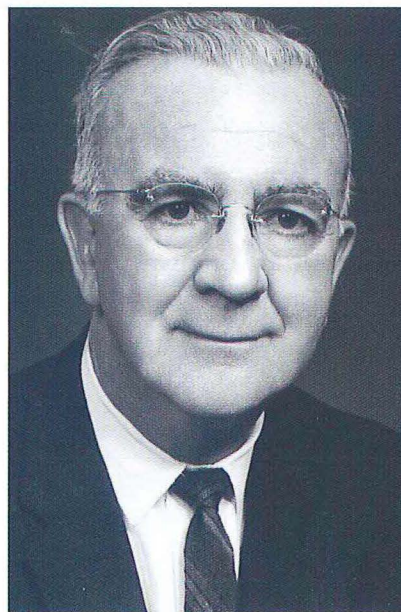
College Receives \$30,000 to Reestablish T. H. Phelps Bursary in Cornwall

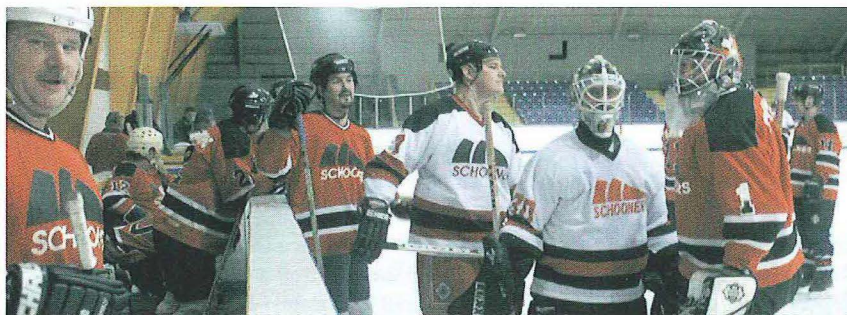

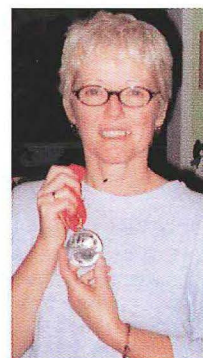
Cynthia Crow Receives Award from Peter Milliken

In fact, it was the instructors, more than anything else who made the experience so meaningful. "It was so much better than a formal university education where you have to call your professors by their titles, if you're even

lucky enough to talk to them at all. At St. Lawrence the instructors encouraged us to talk with them. We were able to build real relationships."

Staddon was also active outside the classroom. In her second year, she was Vice President of Student Life, and planned the orientation activities for Frosh Week. "It really laid the groundwork for what I do now," she says.

Staddon came to Downtown Kingston as a summer student in 1999, but has since found her own niche, as Project Manager, Marketing. She works hand in hand with the others on Downtown Kingston's signature events, such as

the Buskers and Blues festivals, First Night, Chilifest, the Santa Claus parade and others.

Although she's enjoying her career, she still hasn't finished her education. She makes it back to St. Lawrence at least once a year to take marketing courses at night. "I do it for business, but I also do it for fun," she says.

Today all three women work together, making sure that Downtown Kingston will remain viable and vibrant well into the future. And all three know that that future wouldn't be possible had it not been for their beginnings at St. Lawrence College.



We Need Your Help!

College Alumni Asked to Lobby Government

Ontario's Colleges of Applied Arts and Technology are calling on the Ernie Eves government to address serious and continuing underfunding of the college system, and they're seeking the support of college alumni to make sure that government hears the message.

The call comes as the colleges face a severe shortage of operating funding that will seriously jeopardize their ability to accept a massive increase in enrolment caused by provincial government's elimination of the fifth year of high school (known more commonly as 'the double cohort'), population growth and to address a skills shortage in Ontario.

"The colleges face an enormous challenge," says Howard Rundle, Chair of the Committee of Presidents of the Association of Colleges of Applied Arts and Technology and President of London's Fanshawe College. "Thirty-three thousand additional students are expected to enrol at Ontario colleges over the next couple of years. The provincial government has provided adequate funding for new teaching space, and has made an initial three-year commitment on some operating funding, but it is insufficient to begin hiring faculty and purchasing equipment."

This situation comes on top of sharply-reduced funding over the past decade. The total operating grant to colleges from the province has dropped by about nine per cent since 1990-'91, while enrolment has increased by 34 per cent (from 102,000 to nearly 140,000). In terms of per-student funding, colleges receive nearly 40 per cent less per full-time student than they did a decade ago (\$5,775 in 1990-91 versus \$3,475 today).

"This is not a recipe for sustainable excellence, nor is it one for growth," says Rundle. "Thousands of students are counting on the colleges to provide

training and the province's industrial sector needs the expertise of the system to train new employees. Chronic underfunding by government places all of this in jeopardy."

College advocates have been lobbying strongly for months, urging the government to realize that this situation cannot continue. Now, the million or so college alumni across the province are being asked to show their support by contacting cabinet ministers, the premier and MPPs.

"If each college alumni would write a letter, make a phone call, send an e-mail, or meet with a government representative, we should surely be able to make a convincing argument that sustainable, appropriate levels of funding are required to meet the goals of our students and of the economy of Ontario," Rundle says.

"We have clout. Hundreds of thousands of community college graduates have great careers and contribute to the success of the province's economy each day. The colleges support innovation and development across business and industrial sectors, spurring growth and success in the global marketplace. Simply stated: Ontario's colleges and their graduates are the spark plugs in the Ontario economic engine."

The colleges are seeking an additional \$125 million per year to meet the costs of the double cohort and to address the province's skills shortage.

"The solution is clear: if Ontario is going to continue to be in the driver's seat of the Canadian economy, the government of Ontario needs to make a serious, long-term, appropriate and stable investment in its community colleges."

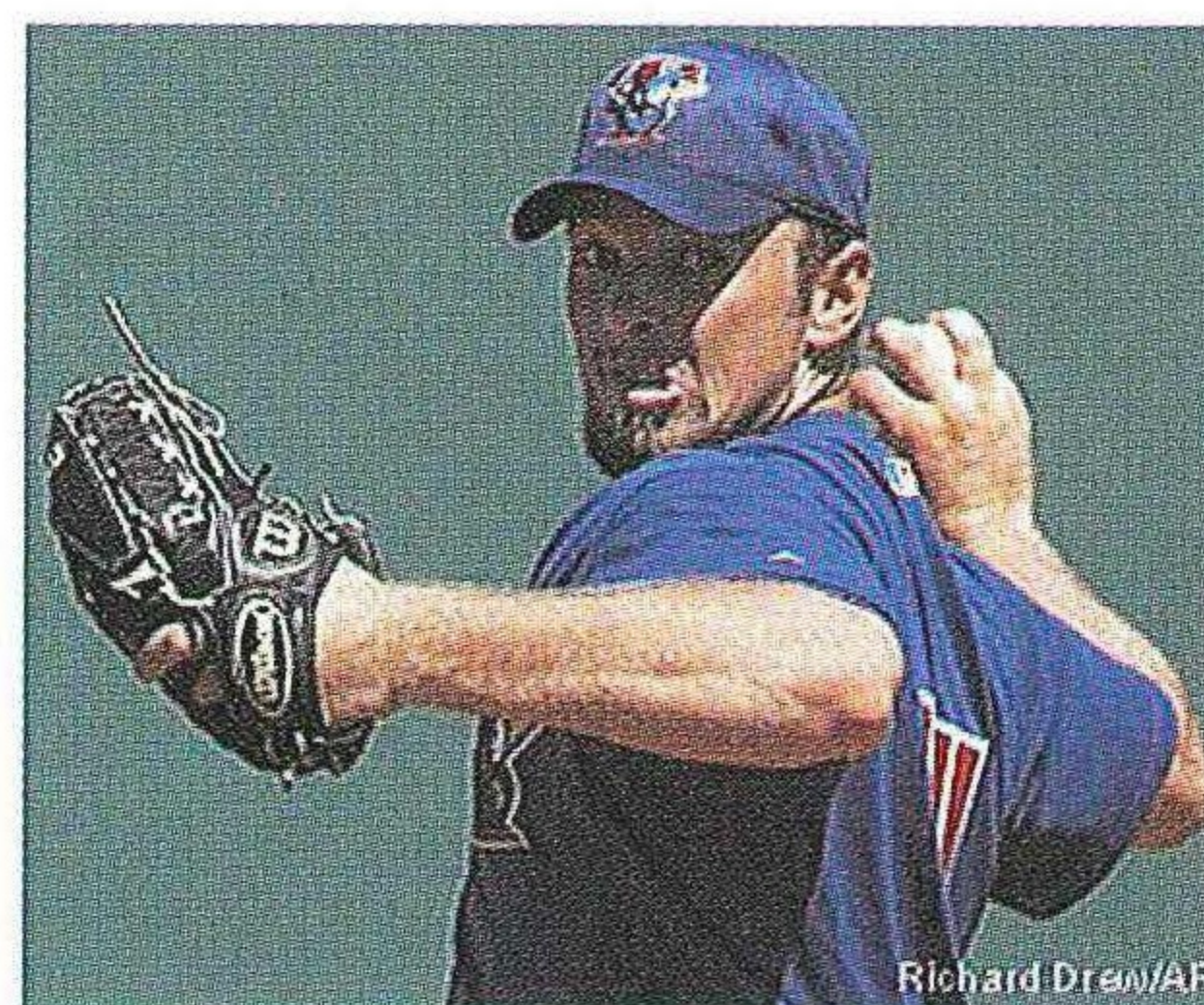

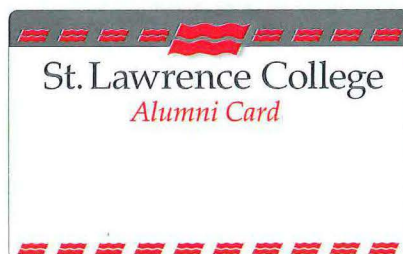

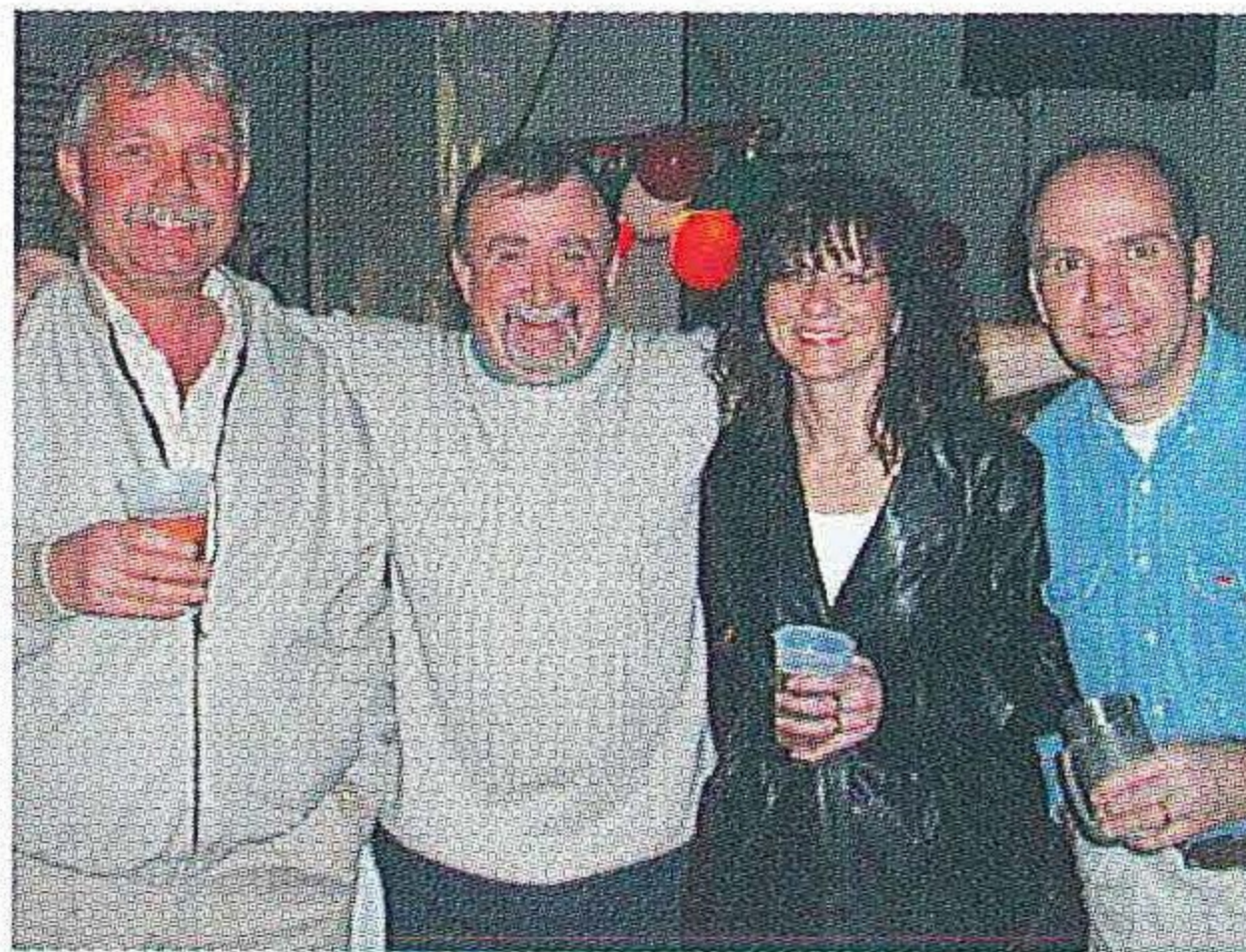
BROCKVILLE

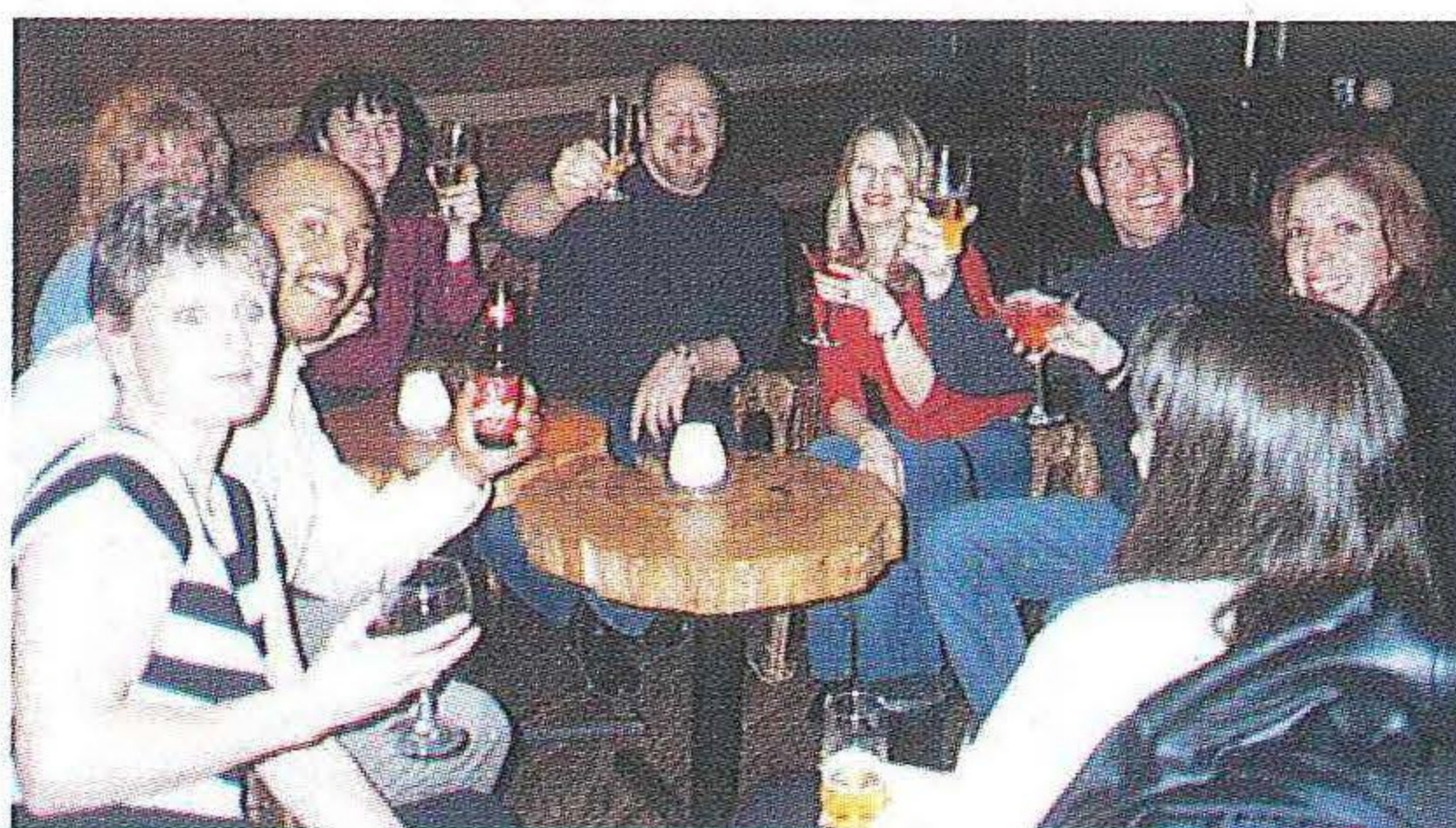

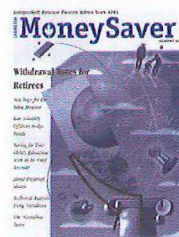

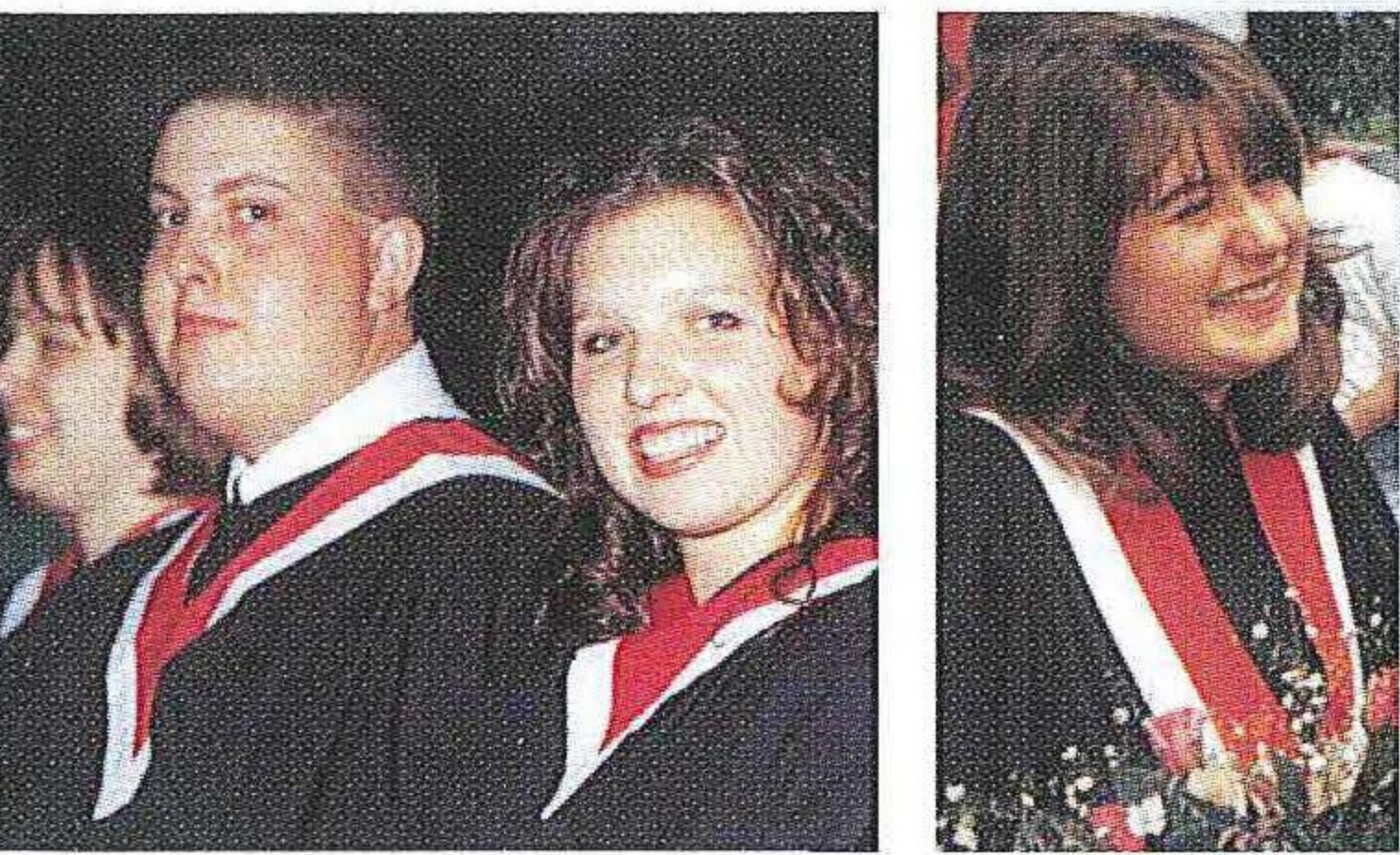

Brad Hill, a professor in the Business Department since 1977, and former Vikings Cross Country Running Coach at the Kingston campus, elected to retire at the end of January.

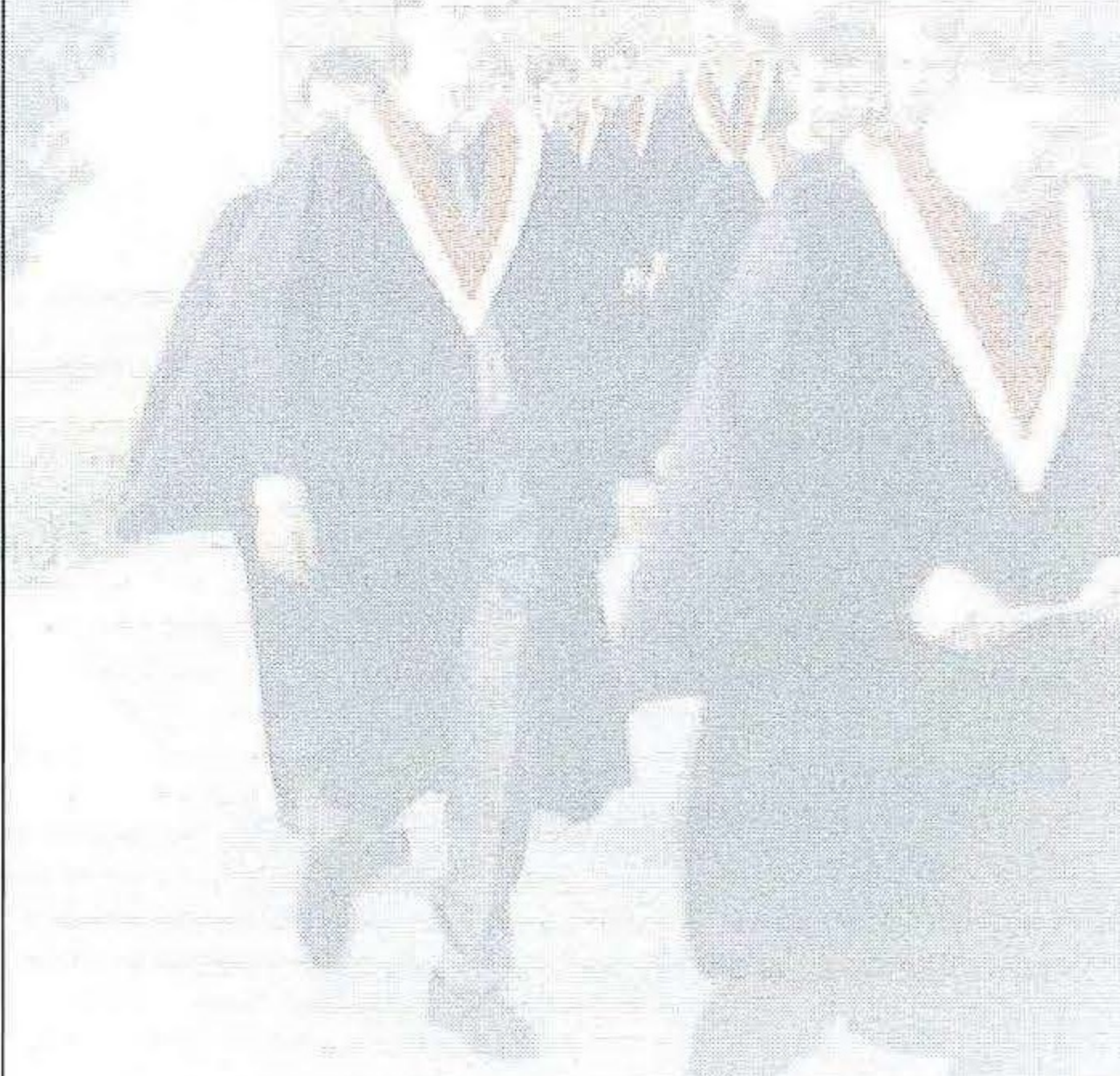
