
We are pleased to present to you our Spring & Summer issue of St. Lawrence Voyageur. This issue is particularly exciting for a number of reasons.

The first is that we can once





Marilyn McFadden

Owner/Operator Lone Wolf Farm Business Administration Finance (Brockville) '81

Marilyn McFadden researched program offerings and then took the plunge and returned to college. She settled on Business Administration Finance, but her career path greatly differed from her anticipated results. "I had visions of working in accounting, perhaps a bank or my own accounting firm," Marilyn said.

Recalling her student days, Marilyn stated, "I liked the fact that instructors at SLC had worked before teaching. Their practical experience related directly to our courses." She graduated just before computers were used in accounting. "I missed out on studying computerized spreadsheets, and other computer applications. (In the 1980's we were using keypunch cards in computer services.) I regret missing this new wave of technology."

After graduation, Marilyn found employment with St. Lawrence College in several different capacities: Personnel Services, Placement Officer and High School Liaison. She stayed home with Clayton and Ginny for a few years and then returned to working at the college on a part-time basis with the Futures program. "I have many great memories from the college, such as College 10 (staff professional development retreats); and I have especially fond memories of former President Bill Cruden," she said. "Working at the college was wonderful and I've met so many great people there."

Marilyn's next career move took a decidedly different direction; she started her own business: Lone Wolf Farm, at Burritt's Rapids, Ontario. Today, she specializes in teaching English horse-




back riding and jumping. Lone Wolf Farms boasts a new indoor training/ exercise arena and a full outdoor training area.

Horses that have been trained and bred on her farm have been sold throughout North America. Two thoroughbred horses born and bred at Lone Wolf Farm ("No Spare Change," a three-year-old gelding, and his full sister, "Lone Willow,") were respectively the Line Horse Champion and the Reserve Champion Line Horse at the Eastern Canadian Thoroughbred Association. Between them, they have won three championships at the Royal Winter Fair in Toronto. Their lineage includes horse legends, Secretariat and Northern Dancer.

Marilyn says it takes many hands to train horses and complete all the duties required around the farm. She typically employs six staff in addition to herself. Marilyn teaches between 35 and 40 students on an ongoing basis. They have a very successful show team on the Hunter/Jumper Circuit and this spring her students won the majority of the awards on the Ottawa Valley Primary Show Circuit. In addition, Marilyn has been operating summer day camps since 1992 attended by children from all over the world.

Marilyn finds farming rewarding, yet very challenging. "For years I've studied and worked with budgets and forecasting, but in farming this proved impossible; there are too many variables," she stated. "The weather has a dramatic impact on business: droughts increase the price of hay and if it's too cold people can't come for lessons. The West Nile disease is a real threat to horses and if the animal is not vaccinated, the disease can be fatal as well, there are constant mechanical equipment challenges."

When asked if she would change anything if she could, Marilyn responded by saying, "I have no regrets, nor would I change a thing. I thank St. Lawrence College for my education, work opportunities and of course for my husband David whom I met at the College. I owe St. Lawrence College a lot!" Marilyn continues to stay in touch with St. Lawrence through David (Director of Student Services and the Department of Part-time Studies) as well as through St. Lawrence Voyageur and her many friends at St. Lawrence.

Foreign Service Technologist, Seoul, Korea Electronics Engineering Technology (Kingston) '84

Study Electronics Engineering Technology and See the World!


It's not a recruiting slogan that we currently use at St. Lawrence, but it has certainly proven to be true for Mike Mowatt.

Following graduation, Mike began his career with Transport Canada as an Electronic Technologist, a job which included travelling to remote areas in northern Ontario, as well as a six-month tour of duty in the high Arctic. In 1991, he accepted an offer from the Department of Foreign Affairs to be a Foreign Service Technologist. That's when the frequent flyer miles really began to add up.

"Over the course of the next two years, the Department of Foreign Affairs sent me to Guyana, Mexico, Poland, Colombia, Cuba, Zambia and Zimbabwe to install new equipment or perform emergency maintenance," says Mowatt. "In 1994, I was posted to Port of Spain, Trinidad, as the Regional Technologist, responsible for Jamaica, Haiti, Guyana, Barbados and Trinidad. In 1996, I was cross-posted to Tokyo, Japan for three years. I had less travel within the region, as Tokyo is a very large mission; however, my maintenance travels took me to Korea, China, and Australia."

Mike was also heavily involved in organizing the technical requirements for the Team Canada Trade Mission to Osaka and Tokyo in 1999, a task that earned him a Merit Award from the Prime Minister of Canada.

After a brief return to Ottawa, Mike began his current posting with



Foreign Affairs in Seoul, Korea, in 2002. The Department of Foreign Affairs and International Trade (DFAIT) represents Canada abroad, through a network of embassies and offices around the world. Their objectives are to promote prosperity, ensure Canadians' security within a global framework, and promote Canadian values and culture on the international stage. In addition to DFAIT staff, the Canadian Embassy in Seoul also has representatives from Citizenship and Immigration Canada, the Department of National Defence, and the Canadian Tourism Commission.

"I am currently a regional Foreign Service Technologist," explains Mowatt, "maintaining voice systems, security and cryptographic systems, WAN and LAN equipment, PCs and servers in the Canadian Embassy in Seoul and within the Asia-Pacific region. Our group supports a worldwide network of voice and data facilities for 165 missions in 110 countries, providing corporate applications and desk-to-desk voice and data connectivity for over 8,800 Canadian and locally engaged staff abroad."

Mike, whose wife Sharon Dowdell is also a St. Lawrence grad (Fashion Design – Kingston '87), has some special memories of his former classmates."We had an extremely diverse class between 1981 and 1984. There were students fresh out of high school like myself, mature students embarking on their second career, foreign students, and even Navy personnel gaining knowledge for their trade. I think I learned some valuable lessons from the older group of students mainly to enjoy what you choose for a career, because you may be doing it for a long time."

Mike and Sharon have an eightyear-old son, Matthew, who was born in Trinidad during one of Mike's postings.

In closing, Mike iterated his appreciation for his St. Lawrence education, and how it has contributed to his current career success. "St. Lawrence College offered me the fundamental knowledge of electronics and systems I needed to develop as a Technologist," he says. "Although I was trained to maintain specific equipment by my employers, I couldn't have succeeded without the experience I received at St. Lawrence College."


Luc Chenier

Executive Creative Director, Bates Ukraine/Eastern Europe Graphic Design '94 (Cornwall)

Luc Chenier graduated from Cornwall's Graphic Design program and then kicked his career into high gear. In trying to locate Luc, we spoke first to his Mom in Alexandria, Ontario. She told us, "Luc likes to keep busy, and he won't be easy to catch." We did manage to locate him in Kiev, Ukraine, and asked if he would share his story with our readers. The following is a snapshot of Luc's career ten years after graduation.

Luc's first career stop was in Regina, Saskatchewan where he joined Palmer Jarvis Advertising as a graphic designer. Next it was on to Phoenix Advertising Group where he honed his craft in advertising (TV, radio and print), starting out as Junior Art Director and quickly advancing to Senior Art Director. While with Phoenix, Luc won many awards for clients such as the Saskatchewan Rough Riders, SaskTel International and WaterGroup International. In addition Luc ran two of his own production companies. His company "ETC" produced large-scale events such as a national snowboard big air competition that drew competing athletes from all over Canada and the United States. Luc's second company produced fullcolour provincial magazines informing tourists and artists on events in the arts.

One day Luc realized that he wanted to see the world while he was still young. Within a week, he shut down both companies and sold off his possessions. He next put the word out to the world that he was on a job hunt. Offers came from multinational advertising agencies in New Zealand and



Eastern Europe. Luc explored both options and accepted the challenge offered from Bates Ukraine. Bates Ukraine is part of Cordiant Holding and is one of the largest advertising agencies in the world, with headquarters in New York and 130 offices worldwide.

Over the next two years the Ukraine office, under Luc's supervision, won Agency of the Year twice and won twice again as the Most Creative Agency in the country. Luc has also brought the agency over 30 international awards and has put Bates Ukraine on the map in the European and international advertising scene. As Executive Creative Director of Ukraine's largest advertising agency, Luc signs off on all work that leaves the agency, ensur-

ing quality of concept, execution and impact.

Luc speaks regularly at industry events and has lectured at universities in the region. He has been published for best marketing practices at St. Petersburg University in Russia and

Minsk University in Belarus.
Judging advertising internationally is a recent addition to Luc's overflowing portfolio.

When asked how St. Law-rence College has assisted with his career, Luc stated, "My training in graphic dess i g n through the college gave

The Province of Ontario has announced a number of new funding initiatives to help Ontarians enter Apprenticeship and Trades Training Programs. St. Lawrence College was awarded \$500,808 to improve and expand the Carpenter Program on its Kingston campus, as well as to provide new and additional equipment for the Millwright, Machinist, Plumbing and Electrical Labs. This funding will enable the College to keep abreast of the latest changes in technology and better prepare its graduates for the new skill challenges required by today's workforce.

In addition, the College was awarded an additional \$125,550 to deliver seven Journeyperson Upgrading Programs. These programs are designed to help skilled workers keep pace with new and emerging technologies. This funding will help make these programs accessible and affordable to tradespersons in our community. Tradespersons such as Electricians, Industrial Mechanic Millwrights, Industrial Electricians, Construction Millwrights and General Machinists can benefit from programs in Computer Aided Drawing (CAD), Programmable Logic Controllers (PLCs) and Hydraulic Training. Tradespersons in the hairstyling industry can benefit from Hairstylist Refresher Training and specific upgrading courses

As part of the College's continued growth in skilled trades, St. Lawrence College is currently expanding its trades programs to provide more opportunities for students this fall. The College will have new programs for Estheticians, Hairstylists, Industrial Maintenance Mechanics and Cooks. These new programs will provide students with more options to access this training locally.

St. Lawrence College is one of the leading colleges in the province in skilled trades training. The St. Lawrence College School of Skilled Trades provides training to Electricians, Machinists, Industrial Electricians, Millwrights, Plumbers, Carpenters, Hairstylists and Estheticians.

For those students who want to pursue a university degree, St. Lawrence College and SUNY have a transfer agreement by which graduates of the Environmental Technician Program may, with appropriate course selection, enter the 3rd year of a Bachelor Degree Program at the Potsdam Campus. The first intake class starts this September 2003.

Spotlight on David Beatty, Chair, SLC Board of Governors



David Beatty's office is brimming with evidence of one of his greatest passions – the game of golf. Look closer, though and you'll also see a great number of plaques, framed certificates and awards that are a testament to another of his loves – community service.

St. Lawrence College is one in a long list of organizations that have benefited from David's time, energy and talents including the Brockville & Area YMCA-YWCA, Kiwanis, the Brockville General Hospital Board of Directors and Foundation, the Leeds & Grenville Economic Roundtable, and Grenville Christian College, to name a few. Currently, David serves St. Lawrence College as Chair of the Board of Governors and as Director on the SLC Foundation.

Born in Winnipeg, David and his family relocated to Brockville in 1953. David's father, Stewart had founded Selkirk Metalworks in Manitoba in the late 40's and felt his business would benefit from a better geographic location – close to the major urban centers of the country's industrial heartland. The business was eventually sold and in 1963 Stewart Beatty acquired an interest in Danor Manufacturing based in Gorrie, Ontario and convinced his new partner to move the operation to Brockville. Danor was a producer of agricultural metal products. In 1969, Danor purchased Canadian Armature Works (Canarm), an established manufacturer of a variety of electrical products including fans and heaters. Operations were ultimately consolidated in Brockville and David joined the company full time in 1971, while in his final year at the University of Western Ontario, where he completed a BA in Economics. In 2000, St. Lawrence College presented David with our highest honour - an Honorary Diploma for his outstanding community leadership.

David has devoted his entire working career to Canarm. Under his stewardship, the corporation has seen sales grow from \$1M to \$55M. The Com-



pany is now a global marketer and manufacturer of lighting, air moving and related products, supplying residential and agricultural markets. In 2002, Canarm was acknowledged as one of Canada's 50 best managed companies. When asked what has created such success

David states: "We have great people. We hire the right ones, give them responsibility and authority and clear goals to meet and then get out of the way."

In his first year as Chair, David is most proud of the improved sense of teamwork he now sees among Board members and within the College management team. "We're marching to the same drum." In looking to the year ahead David sees both challenge and opportunity. "Though we are making progress, we continue to face significant financial challenges ahead. The latest funding announcement is great news, but we still have a long way to go to reach funding parity with the other provinces. We have created 1000 new student spaces in Kingston and our challenge now is to fill those seats." The year ahead is also one of great promise. "The next 12 months will see the completion of our largest ever capital fundraising campaign, the opening of our expanded Kingston Campus, the hosting of the annual ACAATO conference, and continuation of the skilled trades initiative. There is a great deal to celebrate, and much still to be done".

David believes that just like Canarm, St. Lawrence College is poised to achieve great things in the years ahead. Leadership at the Board level will be a vital factor in our success. David and the rest of the Board are ready for the challenge.



New Dining Facilities for Kingston Campus




The Irish are Coming!

St. Lawrence River Institute to Expand Facilities

A new facility for the River Institute is expected to begin construction in June. The new building, located at the Cornwall campus, will enable the River Institute to significantly expand research programs and capitalize on opportunities for additional research and education programs. The College's new Environmental Technician Program's partnership with the St. Lawrence River Institute of Environmental Sciences, will allow students access to an accredited lab setting on campus.



"The new facility will integrate teaching and testing laboratories, a wet lab, an informatics lab/resource centre and supporting structures (offices, workstations, storage, etc.)," reports Dr. Jeff Ridal, Manager and Chief Research Scientist. "It will also feature an outdoor teaching area with a water intake pipe to bring St. Lawrence River water directly into the labs, naturalized landscaping, a research boat, boat ramp and dock. The informatics lab will house an environmental information database and reference collection for the use of students, researchers and the public," he added.

The St. Lawrence River Institute of Environmental Sciences, located in Cornwall, Ontario was established in 1994 as a unique community partner-ship involving government, education, the private sector, and the Mohawk Council of Akwesasne. Its mandate is environmental research and education with a focus on the Great Lakes - St. Lawrence River ecosystem. In addition to comprehensive activities within its region, the River Institute is gaining an international reputation for research projects in developing countries.


Expanding Opportunities Construction and Campaign Roll On

While most of us are preparing to enjoy the lazy days of summer, it's fall that is never far from Blayne Mackey's thoughts. The \$30 million redevelopment of St. Lawrence's Kingston campus has now entered the home stretch. As Project Manager, Blayne is juggling several distinct construction projects on campus, projects that are in various stages of development. Plans call for the completion of the project in September just in time for the double cohort of students entering college.

"We're really in full gear," says Blayne. The new link building and student residence expansions are nearing completion while work on the new cafeteria, dining hall, library and fitness centre is taking shape. With winter semester classes concluding, construction crews have taken over the campus."

Funding for the project is also coming into place. While the project has been successful in obtaining government and private financing for a large portion of construction costs, the St. Lawrence College Foundation has taken up the challenge of raising \$3M in support of the redevelopment of the campus. The 'Expanding Opportunities Campaign' was officially launched to the public on February 13.

"We were very pleased to welcome over 300 guests to the Expanding Opportunities Campaign Launch," explains Peter Kingston, Chair of the St. Lawrence College Foundation. "It was especially rewarding because we were able to advise those in attendance that we had already secured \$2.4M in lead gifts and partner contributions. That's 80% of our goal. There is still a long way

to go, but we are confident that we will be able to achieve our campaign objective by the fall."

"It's exciting to see the campaign coming together in support of this project," says Frank Lockington, Expanding Opportunities Campaign Director. "One just needs to take a close look at the project and the excitement begins to grow. I expect that students coming back to the College next fall and those coming to St. Lawrence for the first time in September will be very impressed."

The Campaign office has arranged for a special tour of the campus while construction is still underway. Saturday, June 14, 9am – Noon, Alumni and Friends of the College are invited to take a sneak preview of the facilities. A number of special door prizes will be presented to visitors. Anyone interested in participating is asked to contact the college's Alumni & Development Office to register.

"We are still very much 'in campaign'," says Frank, "but before we're finished, we want to extend an invitation to Alumni and Friends of the College to be a part of the project. This is a chance for everyone who has benefited from the college to give back, ensuring that those students who follow will benefit as well. It's all about Expanding Opportunities for others."

A New Era in Alumni Relations at St. Lawrence College

Four years ago, the College made a concerted effort to enhance our relations with alumni. This made good sense, seeing as our graduates are our closest, and most loyal friends. Naturally, after you've spent a great deal of time here, where you gleaned the knowledge and acquired the skills which have contributed to your career success and, ultimately, your quality of

We wanted to create a publication which our graduates would read, and would be proud to display in their homes and places of work. A similar review of our web presence followed.

Our next step was to offer you some good reasons to get involved in our Alumni Association. After seeking your input in our inaugural Alumni Survey (2000), we established a formal slate of "alumni perks." These programs and services included, in addition to a free lifetime subscription to St. Lawrence Voyageur, support for reunions, a "grad find" service, a clearing house for information on credit transfer and articulation agreements for other post-secondary institutions, group rates with a few select affinity partners, and more recently, an alumni card tied to a series of exclusive discounts.

The establishment of a network of alumni branches and chapters quickly followed. These are local organizations where the alumni themselves drive a program of special events and activities designed to promote alumni interaction and enhance the visibility of our graduates, both within the College and in the community at large.







Her Excellency, the Right Honourable Adrienne Clarkson, Governor General of Canada, recently granted 20 Medals of Bravery for acts of heroism. Alumnus Wade Briscoe (Machine Shop Kingston '86) of Pembroke, Ontario, and his brother Todd were among those honoured.

On July 14, 2001, in Ottawa, Todd and Wade Briscoe rescued Jean Boileau from the basket of a burning hot air balloon while the latter was risking his life in an attempt to save his daughter from the fire. The balloon had just landed in a field when a gust of wind lifted and propelled it into a high voltage wire. Todd and Wade witnessed

the accident and on their fourth attempt, succeeded, to grab Mr. Boileau by his clothes and pull him and his passenger out of the fire. Todd and Wade Briscoe



were unharmed, while Mr. Boileau suffered serious burns to his face, arms and legs; sadly, his daughter did not survive this tragedy.

Graduates Connect With a Job

Last year St. Lawrence College Job Training Services placed 1639 youth in jobs, of which 261 were college and/or university graduates.

Job Connect is designed for young people between the ages of 16 and 24 who are out of school and out of work. In partnership with community agencies, individuals can access information on the local job market, assist in clarifying their employment goals, develop an action plan, and receive assistance in resume writing and interview skills.

Once individuals are "job ready" they may be eligible for Job Development Placement Supports, which assists participants in developing their skills and gaining experience through job trials, volunteer placements, job shadows, subsidized on-the-job training opportunities or direct employment placements.


Technically Speaking...
