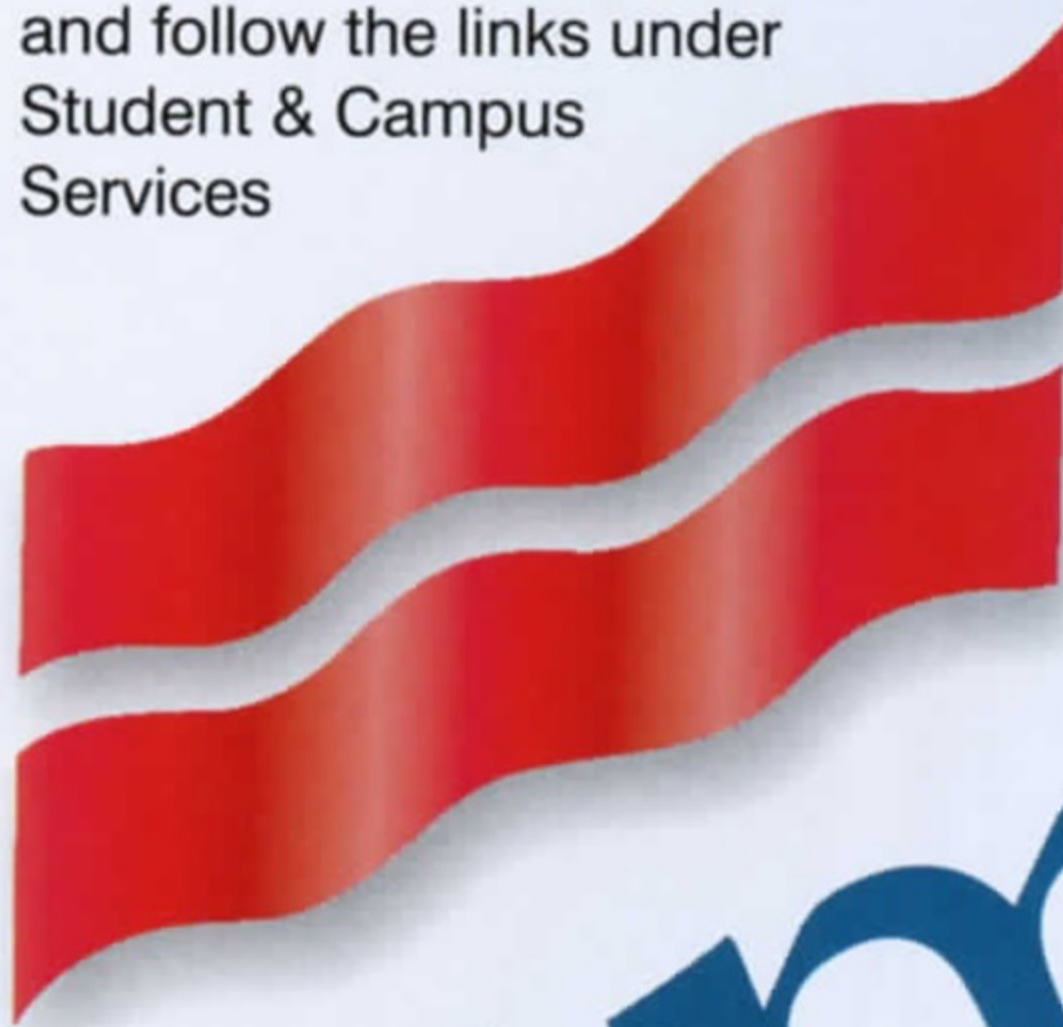

Alumni Profile

*Teacher, Colegio American de Veracruz, Veracruz, México
Business Administration – Accounting '97 (Brockville)*

Despite enjoying a successful position with the Brockville Chamber of Commerce, Tracy Netzke was drawn to see the world. Her current role as an English Teacher in Veracruz, Mexico, is allowing her to do just that.

"Those one-or two-week trips to exotic lands just weren't doing it for me," says Tracy. "I had been to México on vacation before and swore to myself I would return. I wanted to see different parts of the world and this profession, teaching English as a Second Language, is an absolutely wonderful way to take year-long, working vacations, to literally dozens of different countries."

"Right now I teach 40 Mexican students in Colegio American de Veracruz," she explains. "It's somewhat of a stretch from Finance and Accounting, but it's a great change. I was originally drawn to this profession for a couple of different reasons. I am a firm believer in "continuing education," and I will never stop learning. Also, the organizational skills I learned at St. Lawrence were most definitely transferable and are absolutely necessary as a teacher."

"I teach a split class of 16 second graders in the mornings and a class of 24 third graders in the afternoon. There are 800 students alone in the primary section where I am employed, and by my best guess, I would say 200 teachers and support staff. I work for a wonderful lady by the name of Elizabeth Robinson and she is more than willing to share her knowledge with me and recognizes when I'm doing just fine by myself. The school is always on the



lookout for foreign teachers and they love Canadians. I would highly recommend it. Although we're paid in pesos, the teachers in these schools earn a great living by local standards."

After graduating from St. Lawrence, Tracy worked for the Public Utilities Commission in the Finance and Service Departments, before being hired on with the Brockville Chamber of Commerce.

"With the Chamber, I was originally hired due to my Accounting knowledge and ability to interact with other people. My initial position was entitled "Administrative Assistant" and I helped to organize the Executive Director's schedule as well as helping to serve the client base of approximately 500 local business members and their 10,000 employees."

Over the five-year period she spent with the Chamber, Tracy was recognized for her ability to organize, work hard, and achieve results. Her position, title and salary progressed with added responsibilities, and eventually the organization created a new administrative position for her. "Then I had official responsibilities of my own, rather than simply helping "a boss." I planned the annual budget under the tutelage of an excellent accountant, Michael McMahon of the Bennett, Lewis, McMahon, Stillar, Chartered Accounting firm. With his guidance, help and amazing patience, I really learned so much about the necessary ingredients and about the questions one must ask, ponder and address to run a successful business. I loved my position at the Chamber."

Tracy's natural talent with number is what originally led her to enroll in the Business Administration–Finance program at the Brockville campus. She also understood that knowledge of how to organize a business would be a very transferable skill.

"St. Lawrence College teachers and friends have left me with wonderful memories. The faculty was always happy and helpful," Tracy recalls. "I must admit, *only* because Glenn Mackey agreed to provide help to me *on his personal time*, did I ever concede now to give my home phone number to my own students. I really believe the friendly teachers and "help, help, help" attitude provided by SLC staff have in turn made me into a teacher who really

Steve Dine

*Substance Abuse Specialist, Correctional Service of Canada
Correctional Worker '83 (Kingston)*

As a specialist in the area of substance abuse, Steve Dine has become highly sought-after as a trainer, expert witness, and international consultant. It adds up to a very interesting and varied career for this graduate of Kingston's Correctional Worker program.

Steve always had an interest in working in the federal correctional system, and had heard from friends about the great program at St. Lawrence. "With ten institutions within driving distance from Kingston," he says, "I thought it would be a good career choice - and it was."

While at SLC, Steve was impressed with the program, as well as his professors. "I am so thankful for St. Lawrence College and the great array of teachers that I had at that time. People like Stuart Payne, David McKay and Grant Stevens were more than just information providers - they were very motivating, caring people who went out of their way to help. They are part of the reason that I continue to assist St. Lawrence students in whatever way I can."

After graduation, Steve worked part-time at the Quinte Detention Center and then was hired full-time by the Correctional Service of Canada (CSC) as a Correctional Officer at Collins Bay Institution. Within 18 months, he was promoted to Living Unit Officer and spent the next five years at Joyceville and Frontenac Institutions. After that, Steve received training in substance abuse and went on to deliver programs in that area in the newly formed Correctional Programs Department at Frontenac and Pittsburgh Insti-



position since 1996.

"My role with CSC is to train and provide quality assurance to all staff in the Ontario Region delivering substance abuse programs, both in the male institutions and the community parole office sites," Steve explains. "I have also been part of the development team that recently put forward and received international accreditation (in December of last year) for a new trio of multi-level, substance-abuse programs for federal offenders. I participate in many competition boards to hire new Correctional Program Officers as well as overseeing CSC Intensive Support Units (ISU) which are dedicated drug-free ranges or units that have additional security/detection mandates to

illegal substances."

Steve is increasingly being recognized as a leading innovator in the field. In 2002, he received the Queen's Golden Jubilee medal for his work with St. Lawrence, working with program development and training staff in other countries and jurisdictions in substance-abuse programming. He is also a part of CSC's National Substance Abuse Committee. Steve has received special recognition from the Commissioner of Corrections for his role in developing CSC's new substance-abuse programs and has been recognized by the National Headquarters as being nationally certified to train staff in their program cadre.

This year, Steve will be receiving his Exemplary Service Medal for 20 years of service. In the past, he has also have received certificates for volunteer activities that he has been involved in within CSC and was nominated in 2002/2003 for The Teacher of the Year Award in the School of Applied Arts at St. Lawrence. He has provided training in Bermuda and Baffin Island and will be returning to Sweden shortly for his fifth training session there. And if that's not enough success for you, Steve has recently been designated as an expert witness for substance-abuse programs, and has been called upon to testify at several dangerous offender sentencing hearings.

Despite having a very full schedule, Steve makes a point of staying connected to his alma mater. "I have acted as a site supervisor for many BST

It's always rewarding when one of our graduates becomes President.

Gordon MacNair always enjoyed assuming a leadership role at St. Lawrence College. All the students looked up to him for bringing a team together. One of his key activities was orchestrating Christmas, Easter and Graduation parties for the 150 students and guests living in residence. The extravagant parties were held at the Royal Hotel & Civic Complex in Cornwall. The bands were "out of this world," and the food and comederie were spectacular—word has it that Cornwall has not seen as much excitement since.

At St. Lawrence, Gord was able to experience different leadership roles including being involved with the student government and as Chairperson of the 150-room residence. He remarks that these varied experiences were able to help him attain a healthy sense of leadership.

It was through St. Lawrence that Gord was introduced to the Appraisal Institute of Canada. Upon his graduation he was able to attain his AACI designation when he was twenty-eight, which opened up numerous opportunities for him throughout his career.

Gordon will become President of the International Right of Way Association on June 24 at the IRWA international conference in Philadelphia. It is only the second time in the history of the Association that a Canadian has become President. The International Right of Way Association operates in the United States and Canada and has affiliates in South Africa and Japan. The association comprises a global commu-



nity of over 10,000 dedicated Right of Way professionals. Since its inception as a not-for-profit association in 1934, the IRWA, headquartered in Los Angeles, has united the efforts of its members toward individual development, improved service to employers and the public, and advancement in the body of knowledge related to the professional tasks of its members. Members receive cutting-edge solutions to industry challenges through specialized education courses and seminars, a program of professional development, and as thought-provoking forums for the exchange and advancement of ideas.

In addition to the IRWA, Gordon has also been involved in other leadership roles with Toastmasters International, the Appraisal Institute of Canada,

the Real Estate Institute of British Columbia and the Builders and Owners Managers Association.

Gord is presently employed with the City of Ottawa as Manager; Appraisals, Environmental Remediation & Special Projects. Having worked in the municipal environment for the past eleven years, he currently oversees all appraisals that are required for city purposes, which includes the acquisition of new properties and the disposal of surplus properties. His team oversees environmental remediation, which involves the cleaning up of city-owned contaminated sites and managing the Old Landfill Program and Underground Storage Tank Program for the City.

Prior to his employment with the City of Ottawa, Gord was employed for seven years by Ontario Hydro; he started off as a Property Agent and worked his way up to Project Supervisor, where he oversaw a team that was responsible for buying property for a large hydro transmission project in southwestern Ontario. Prior to his role at Ontario Hydro, he worked as a Property Agent in British Columbia and as a lender with Canada Permanent Trust and the Central Mortgage & Housing Corporation.

Gord also has a part-time business involving adult education and he has made presentations throughout Canada, the United States and South Africa. He is a certified instructor for the Appraisal Institute of Canada, BOMA and the International Right of Way Association. He recently had two arti-

Residence Projects Underway in Cornwall and Kingston

St. Lawrence College is responding to the increasing demand for convenient, safe, quality student housing with residence projects in both Cornwall and Kingston.

In Cornwall, work is now underway to renovate a portion of Moulinette Hall to create a 44-bed residence. Each suite is fully furnished, offering private sleeping and study space and a shared washroom for every two bedrooms. The facility also features a beautiful common lounge and kitchenette that overlooks the St. Lawrence River and an on-site laundry room. Applications are now being received, for occupancy beginning in September 2004. Based on the number of inquiries we are receiving, we are confident the facility will fill quickly.

In Kingston, design work is now complete for Phase 3 of our residence operations. This new six-story section will be located off the south end of the original building. The greater number of floors, compared to the original four stories, will give the new wing a smaller footprint on the site. A spacious sixth floor lounge will offer students a view over Lake Ontario. The 205 new suites in this wing will bring our total complement of on campus housing to 600 beds. In this latest addition, all rooms will be private, fully furnished, and include their own bathrooms. Students will sign an 8-month lease for the aca-

demic year. Year after year, the demand for convenient, secure housing has continued to escalate, and we are pleased to be responding with additional premium housing spaces on the Kingston campus beginning in September 2005.

cares 24 / 7. My students sometimes call my home when they are stuck, and I like this way of teaching - - both as a student and as a teacher. I wouldn't want it any other way."

"Also, the happy, friendly environment provided at St. Lawrence College is reflected in my classroom and in the children's eyes. They are free to talk when they need to, or simply because they want to actually speak some English. I like that they feel

comfortable with me and respect the rules (for the most part) at the same time. Again, I found this to be the case in the SLC classrooms. Last, the class size at SLC when I attended didn't exceed 30 students. This intimate atmosphere, for me, was much more agreeable than the 300- student classroom in my first year university Calculus course."

Tracy has many fond memories of the staff at the Brockville campus, in-

cluding Glenn Mackey, Jim Miller, Cathy TeKamp, and her varsity soccer coach, Bill Ault.

Tracy will finish her school term this July, and is looking forward to returning to Brockville to be with her boyfriend, Dan deLuis. Many new and exciting things are happening at St. Lawrence College, so we wanted to take this opportunity to bring you up to date with some news highlights.

Here are some campus-specific updates:

KINGSTON CAMPUS

- Our newly renovated facilities are fully functional, and our students are loving it! We have new multi-media classrooms, a larger dining hall, and expanded library facilities, including a spacious and bright reading room.
- We are adding onto the residence yet again! With a new wing of rooms, we will be able to accommodate 600 students by September 2005.
- Our new fitness center has been bustling with activity. This 15,000-square foot, two-story facility features a fully equipped conditioning floor, two squash courts, an aerobics studio and change rooms. Operated in partnership with the Kingston Family YMCA, membership entitles users to year-round access, not only to the branch on campus but to other branches in town, as well as visiting privileges at YMCAs across Canada.
- Our new Digital Arts for Musicians program has recently been approved by the Ministry of Training Colleges and Universities. The program is designed for students who wish to continue studies in voice or a musical instrument while acquiring skills in producing art forms that integrate images, sound and music using computer technology.

- St. Lawrence College is pleased to announce the launch of a new degree program, Bachelor of Applied Arts - Behavioural Psychology, starting in Kingston in September, 2004.
- We are adding on to the residence yet again! With a new wing of rooms, we will be able to accommodate 600 students by September 2005.
- Hotel & Restaurant Management students have opened their restaurant for business. Students in this program are now able to put their new skills to work both in the kitchen and on the restaurant floor.
- More Esthetics students will be on campus in September. Due to the high demand for the program, we will be accommodating two additional sections of students.

BROCKVILLE CAMPUS

- The Cornwall Campus will be offering the Carpentry-General full-time certificate program commencing September 2004.
- The Computerized Business Systems program at the Cornwall Campus has been replaced by the one-year Office Administration program.
- The Mechanical Engineering – Electromechanical Technician program will be running once again this year at the Cornwall Campus. There are many exciting employment opportunities awaiting graduates of this two-year diploma program.
- The College is receiving a large number of applications for the Paramedic program. Students applying to this program are encouraged to indicate a second choice of interest to avoid disappointment.

St. Lawrence College Receives Apprenticeship Funds to Expand and Relocate Plumbing Shop on Kingston Campus

Ontario Premier Dalton McGuinty announced in April that his government will invest nearly \$18 million in Ontario's Apprenticeship Training Programs. "This government is committed to building a strong and prosperous economy by developing our people," said the Premier. "These apprenticeship programs will provide Ontarians with more opportunities to enter challenging and well-paid careers in the skilled trades."

ment in apprenticeship programs last year saw St. Lawrence College awarded over \$500,000. This allowed the College to build a new state-of-the-art Carpentry lab and to improve our Electrical, Hairstyling and Esthetician labs. Through these investments, the College is responding to the need for skilled workers in Ontario by providing more opportunities for students to learn in modern facilities with new equipment.

As part of the College's continued

growth in skilled trades, St. Lawrence is currently expanding its trades programs to provide more opportunities for students this fall. In addition to expanded intakes for Carpenters, Electricians, Plumbers and Estheticians, the College will offer new programs for Advanced Hairstyling and Advanced Cook Apprentices, as well as a one year Chef training program and a two year Culinary management Program - all starting in September 2004.



This announcement will benefit approximately 28,000 apprentices across the province by helping colleges update their classrooms and equipment. It means people learning to be cooks, carpenters electricians and others will be able to learn on the most up-to-date equipment and study on cutting-edge technology.

St. Lawrence College was awarded \$667,625.00 to improve, expand and locate the Plumbing Shop on Kingston campus, as well as provide new and additional equipment for the Millwright, Machinist, Carpenter and Electrical Labs. This funding will enable the College to increase its capacity to train additional plumber apprentices and to keep abreast of the latest changes in technology, to better prepare its graduates for the new skill challenges required by today's workforce.

OPP Commissioner receives Honorary Diploma

Commissioner Gwen M. Boniface was presented with the highest honour awarded by the St. Lawrence College Board of Governors on April 26. The Honorary Diploma recognizes her outstanding example, inspiration and leadership to the graduates of the College.

The award was presented by Board member Neil Burke during a ceremony that took place in the Aultsville Theatre in Cornwall. Cornwall Police Chief Dan Parkinson, Akwesasne Deputy Police Chief Steve Lazore, Mayor Phil Poirier, a number of local representatives of the Ontario Provincial Police and the RCMP, as well as the students and staff of the Police Foundations Program at St. Lawrence College were in attendance.

Commissioner Gwen Boniface began her policing career with the Ontario Provincial Police in 1977. Twenty-one years later she was named Commissioner and she now leads more than 7,000 OPP uniformed and civilian members serving Ontario.

President of St. Lawrence College, Volker Thomsen, reflected on Commissioner Boniface's exceptional career and praised her for her dedication and accomplishments. "Our students can certainly learn from the Commission-

er's achievements," he said. "She is an inspiration to all and a model of success for our female students." Commissioner Boniface was the first female to have held the position of President of the Canadian Association of Chiefs of Police and the first Canadian police officer to be elected Vice Chair of the Division of State and Provincial Police of the International Association of Chiefs of Police.

"Commissioner Boniface is well deserving of this sort of recognition," said Cornwall's Police Chief Daniel Parkinson. "She is a highly regarded law enforcement professional and a visionary for policing in Ontario."

When accepting the diploma, Commissioner Boniface expressed her gratitude. "It is a great honour to be recognized by St. Lawrence College. I am especially pleased and proud that this recognition will help to highlight policing as a great opportunity for young people, including St. Lawrence College graduates, who are considering careers and professions within the criminal justice system. My career in policing has afforded me a wealth of opportunities: combine my academic and professional training with a great variety of interesting and compelling experiences in the field of justice."

D.S.W. Student Receives Provincial Award

Melissa Virgin, a second-year Developmental Services Worker student at the Kingston campus, has been selected by the Ontario Association on Developmental Disabilities (OADD) to receive the Kay Sansom Scholarship. Three awards of \$1,000 each and one-year memberships in OADD are available to Ontario students with interests in developmental disabilities: medical and graduate students, undergraduate students, and community college students. The award must be used to pursue a full-time, specific, educational goal in a recognized program associated with a professional discipline related to developmental disabilities.

While completing her final semester in the D.S.W. program this winter, Melissa has also been employed in her field, both as an Educational Assistant with a local school board and as a Support Worker with area individuals and their families. After Melissa graduates from the D.S.W. program this June, she plans to attend Ryerson University where she will complete a Bachelor of Applied Arts in Disability Studies.

placement students," he says, "and have taught Overview of Addictions at the College for the past eight or nine years. I have also served on the BST Advisory Board for many years and have presented the CSC award of excellence to graduating BST students and to returning first and second year students as well."

Annual Report on Giving

2003 - 2004

The St. Lawrence College Foundation recently completed its most successful year to date. Established in 1998, the Foundation has seen consistent growth each year. In 2003- 2004, the success of the Expanding Opportunities Campaign in Kingston, combined with the introduction of the Opportunity Trust Fund matching gift-program for student bursaries, moved the Foundation to a new level of support for St. Lawrence College.

Our mandate

The St. Lawrence College Foundation exists to support the College in its mission. The Foundation has four key areas of responsibility:

Advocacy

First and foremost, the Foundation aims to advocate on behalf of the College and our students. Regionally, the Foundation's Directors have been directly involved with telling "the St. Lawrence story" through the media, in addition to supporting our public fundraising campaign activity in the communities we serve. Provincially, a major advocacy campaign has been undertaken for much of the year in an attempt to educate both politicians and the general public about the critical role our college system plays as a catalyst for economic and social development.

Raising of funds

The second key area of activity for the Foundation is the raising of needed funding to support the College and its students. In September, Peter Kingston, Chair of the Foundation, announced that we had exceeded our \$3 million Expanding Opportunities Campaign goal in Kingston, and that we would be extending the campaign for an additional two years to raise up to \$2 million in new donations and matching funding specifically for student bursaries at the Kingston campus. At the same time, work has also begun to assess the opportunities to raise funds in support of the Brockville and Cornwall campuses.

College-wide, almost 900 individuals, organizations and foundations made a gift to the Foundation in 2003/2004. Up from 628 recorded donors in the previous year, this represents an increase in participation of 43%.

Management of fund held in trust

The Foundation's Board takes its "stewardship" responsibilities very seriously. This third area of Foundation activity relates to our role in overseeing the management of donor funds held in trust for the benefit of the College and our students. A new information system in the College' Development Office has been introduced; when fully implemented, it will provide even more detail regarding each donation made and how these donor investments directly benefit St. Lawrence College students. Managing the investment of our endowment fund is also a priority. The equity in our collective endowed bursary funds has grown by 15% this past year. Endowed funds held in trust by our Foundation now total almost \$1.37 million. Each year, interest earned from these funds supports our students in need through the student awards program.

Strategic Expenditures

Making expenditures back into the College is certainly one of the most rewarding activities for our Foundation's Directors. This year, we have been very strategic in expending donor dollars. Most gifts come to the Foundation with specific directions. Much of the money raised in the past few years has been directed toward support for the expansion of our Kingston campus through the Expanding Opportunities Campaign. This year we have passed on to the College over \$750,000 in funds from donor gifts and pledge payments for this purpose.

A record 395 student awards were presented to students this year at either our annual spring convocation or our fall student awards night. These were in addition to the 151 academic "Distinctive Awards" that are also supported by our Foundation. The student bursary endowed funds have grown by \$172,000 this year. The St. Lawrence College Foundation also authorized the expenditure of over \$57,000 in support of instructional capital. Under the province's College Equipment Renewal Fund, this Foundation investment leveraged a further \$172,000 for equipment purchases last year.

On a pilot basis, \$25,000 has been set aside to support new bursaries that will be specifically directed toward encouraging new applications and confirmations for selected programs at each campus. The goal for the future will be to have the application approval for many of our new awards align with enrolment approvals for first-year entrants. This initiative directly supports our college's goal to increase enrolment through access and retention.

The year ahead

The 2004-2005 year promises to be very exciting, with initiatives underway at all three campuses.

On April 1st, we are launching our annual appeal with a request to all staff to support the Opportunity Trust Fund student bursary matching-gift program. The alumni appeal will take place throughout the fall and winter months. Again, our request will be to have donors consider directing their gifts toward the matching-gift bursary opportunity.

In Brockville and Cornwall, we expect to intensify activity in support of specific projects and the bursary fund.

2004 Premier's Awards – Call for Nominations

The Premier's Awards for Graduates of Ontario's Colleges of Applied Arts and Technology honour the important social and economic contribution college graduates make to Ontario. The Awards were launched in 1992 to mark the 25th anniversary of Ontario's colleges.

Presented annually, the Premier's Awards acknowledge six outstanding graduates from Applied Arts: Creative Arts and Design; Applied Arts: Community Services; Business; Health Sciences; and Technology. The sixth category - Recent Graduate - was estab-

lished to mark the Awards' 10th anniversary.

Chosen from nominations submitted by Ontario's 25 colleges, nominees demonstrate career success related to their college experience and have made a significant contribution to their community.

Each of the six recipients receives a Premier's Award medal designed by sculptor Dora de Pédery-Hunt. In addition, a \$5,000 bursary is directed to the college of the recipient's choice.

Nominations for potential candi-

dates should be based on outstanding career success, awards and recognition, community involvement, and ongoing contribution to the College or to the colleges system. Overcoming challenges or hardship to achieve success may also be considered.

St. Lawrence requests that all nominations include point-form references to each of the selection criteria. All nominations should be directed to the Alumni Relations Office, and must be received on or before August 1 for consideration for this year's awards.

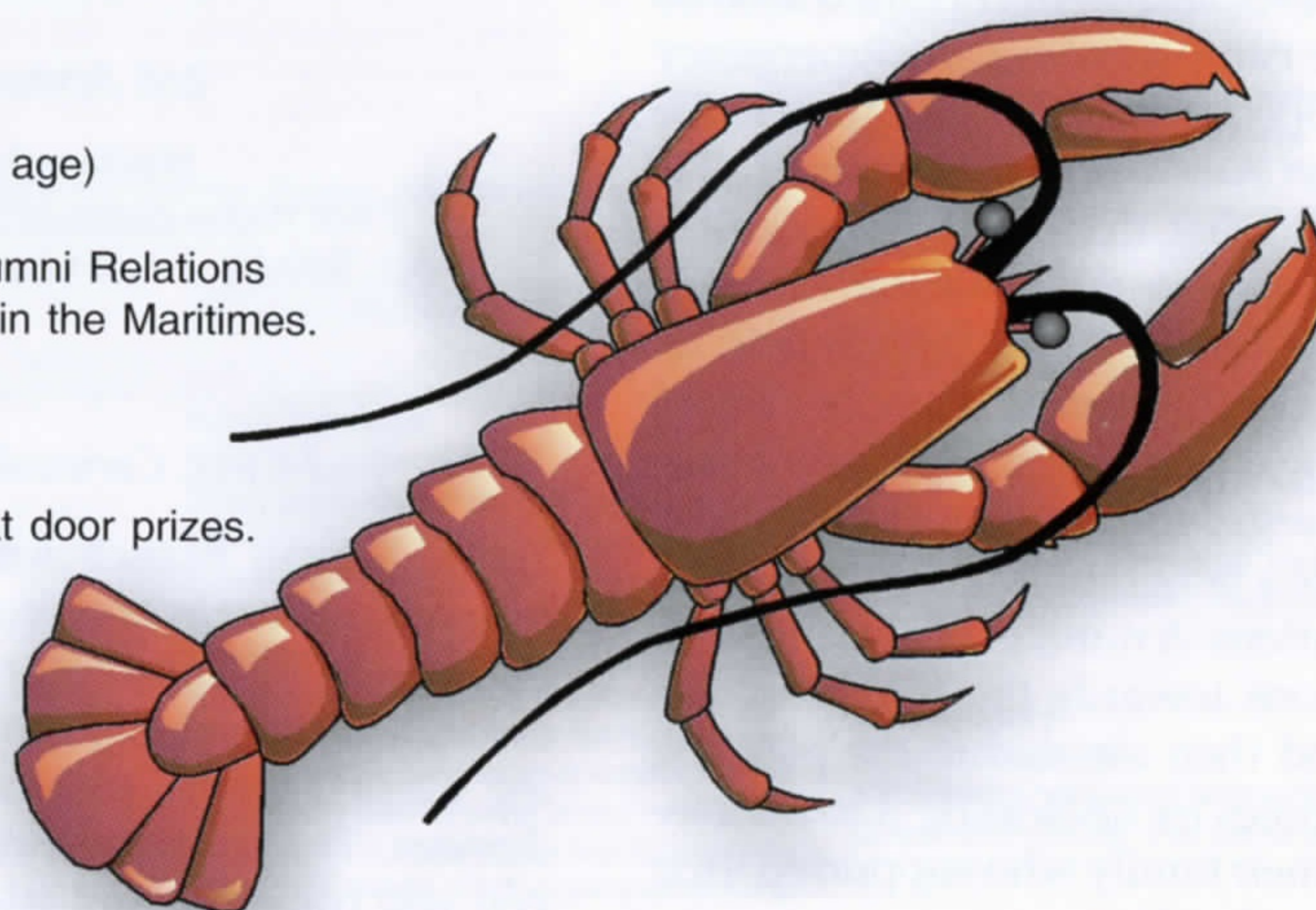

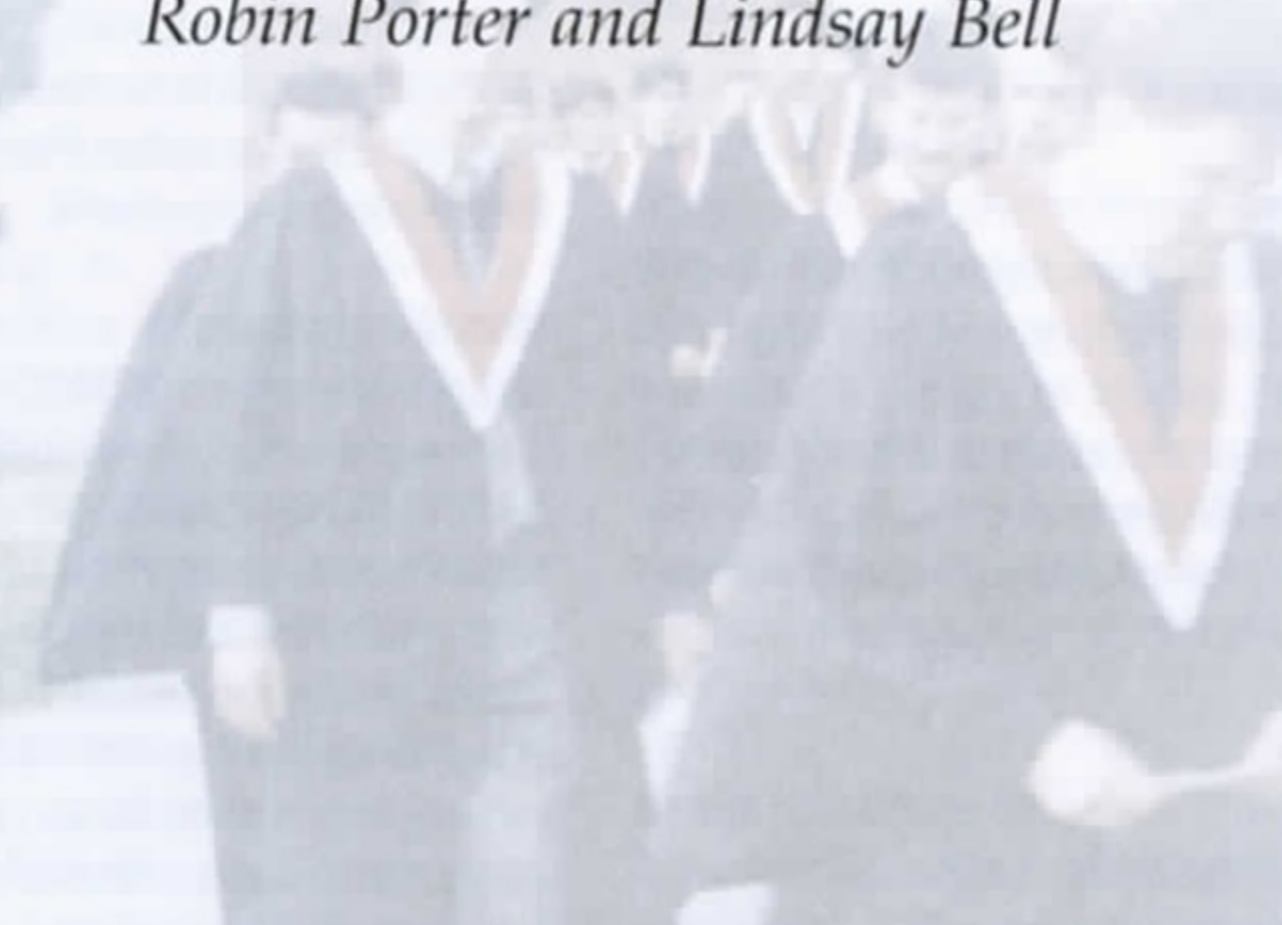

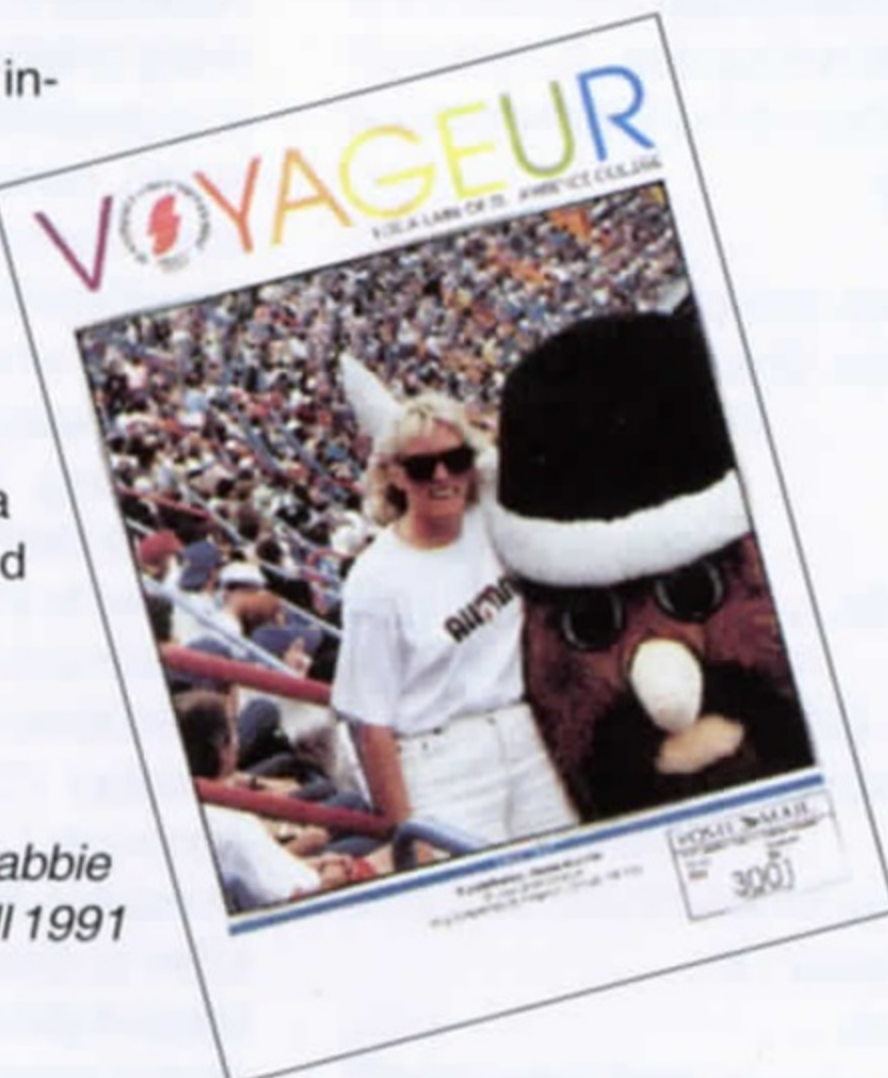
