



Jeanna Andre

Advertising & Public Relations (K) '01

"I got a job in my field within five months of graduation, and I know it was because of my St. Lawrence education." This quote from Jeanna Andre from her on-line Alumni Record Update (www.sl.on.ca/alumni), caught our attention in the Alumni Office just as we were in the midst of choosing our latest Alumni Profile candidates. After some initial conversations with Jeanna, we knew that hers was one of those great success stories that we just had to share.

"In March of 2001, I was in Ottawa for the weekend visiting friends, and as I walked around the city I thought I would really love to live here and start a life for myself," recalls Andre. "The next day I cold- called the NewRO."

The NewRO is the only independent television station in the Nation's Capital. In the fall of 2000, it opened its doors to a brand new state of the art broadcasting facility located in the heart of Ottawa's Byward Market. The unique multimedia complex is called CHUM Market Media Mall, and is specially designed to house both television and radio broadcast facilities.

Eventually, Andre received an interview with News Director Richard Grey, who was impressed with Andre's field placement experience with Bravo!, as well as her success at the College's Greg Awards. She was offered a job as Floor Director for "NewsSixOttawa," and began right after Labour Day.

"As Floor Director, my main responsibility is that I am the 'eyes and ears' of the control booth," Andre explains. "I take my cues from the Director, Technical Director, and Audio Director. During the news I am in charge



of the studio environment, meaning that I cue the anchors to positions, indicate when they are on camera or off, and if they have a voice-over, etc. I make sure the camera operators are in their proper places when they need to be, and keep an eye out for any lighting or audio problems. In general, my job is to ensure that the overall look of the show is up to our expectations."

Andre, who attended high school at Regiopolis Notre-Dame in Kingston, was initially enrolled in Fashion Management at George Brown College in Toronto. While back in Kingston at Christmas, Andrea found out about St. Lawrence's Advertising and Public Relations program while flipping through one of our Career Guides. "I knew it was something I wanted to pursue," she says. "I took an English

class that spring, and enrolled in the APR program in the fall."

In her first year, Andrea was the Co-Vice-President of the Greg Awards Planning Committee, an event which recognizes outstanding student work in video production. "I worked really hard to make it a formal event and to make sure that we had a great venue to do it in. In second year, our group did the video for The Canadian College of Naturopathic Medicine. We were editing for nearly three months, and I think we managed to make a really great video." The judges seemed to agree, awarding Andrea's group with an impressive seven out of ten Gregs. "It was one of the best nights ever. To know all your hard work paid off is just so rewarding."

Andre has some particularly fond memories, surrounding her Greg Awards experience, of a particular professor who went above and beyond the call of duty to support his students. "Tom Harpell was great! He would stay until the wee hours of the morning to edit the videos, and his no-nonsense way of teaching was very refreshing. One day in particular stands out for me. I had an interview for a commercial production job and had to make, edit and present two mock commercials. Not only did he come with me to shoot the pieces, but he did so after driving all night from Thunder Bay in a snowstorm. He came in at six a.m. to help me edit the piece for my interview that afternoon. There aren't too many people who give of their time the way he does."



Alex Glashan (nee Wentzel)

Hotel / Restaurant Management (B) '96



Alex Glashan is a shining example of someone who is successful in her field. Her career in Hotel / Restaurant Management has provided her with numerous opportunities for travel and a wide variety of employment experiences. These experiences, coupled with her St. Lawrence diploma, have allowed her to rise through the industry ranks to her current position as Assistant Banquet Manager at the Westin Bayshore Resort & Marina in Vancouver.

In her current position, Glashan is responsible for overseeing the daily operations of a 51,000 sq. ft. conference facility (including the largest ballroom in western Canada), as well as outside catering contracts to many venues in the Vancouver area. Glashan oversees the work, training and scheduling of five supervisors and over 150 line employees. She also hires and trains all new banquet servers, bartenders and housemen.

"The most rewarding aspect of my job is watching sales contracts unfold into wonderful and successful events," Glashan explains, "making occasions like someone's wedding, the most important day of their life, into an event to remember. I also enjoy helping to make a conference a success, after many months of planning and hard work."

Overseeing such a large staff isn't always easy, but it's a task that Glashan is certainly prepared for. "Managing a staff of 150 can be challenging, and it is sometimes difficult to mesh so many personalities into a well-oiled team. But its also very rewarding to see people that I have coached and trained go on to successes of their own."

While studying at the College's Brockville campus, Glashan did her coop placement with Canadian Pacific Hotels (now Fairmont Hotels and Resorts) at Jasper Park Lodge in Alberta. She made a favourable impression during that period, and was hired immediately following graduation. Just one month later she was promoted to Captain, and then shortly thereafter, to Assistant Dining Room Manager. She also went on to hold the positions of Assistant Room Service Manager, and Beverage Manager, learning all aspects of the field.

"I left Jasper Park Lodge in November of '97 to become Assistant Restaurant Manager in Griffin's Restaurant in CP's (now Fairmont's) Hotel Vancouver. In '98 I became the Assistant Banquet Manager, working in that area until 2000, when I decided that I might like to learn more about the "rooms" aspect of the hotel industry. I switched over and took on the role of Assistant Front Office Manager, a position I held until I was approached by the Westin Bayshore."

The hotel had recently undergone a series of renovations, and had added a large Conference Centre. They needed someone with experience to help them grow into a large scale operation, and Glashan fit the bill perfectly. It was then that she moved into her current role as Assistant Banquet Manager.

Glashan has nothing but good things to say about her time at St. Lawrence. "When I was choosing a school, I visited many institutions throughout southern Ontario," she says. "The Coordinator of the Hotel / Restaurant Management program, Doug Roughton, made time to meet and sit down with me, and give me a tour of the facility, Motluks. I felt instantly comfortable and knew that this environment would help me to succeed. I attribute a lot of my success to the motivation and support I received from the program at St. Lawrence, and especially Mr. Roughton."

"Istill keep in touch with my former classmates, and we make time each year to travel across the country to see each other. My best friends in the world are the ones I made while at St. Lawrence College."

Peggy Houlden (nee O'Neill)

Retail Management (C) '77 Business Administration - Computing & Information Processing (C) '79 Business Administration - Finance (C) '82

Peggy Houlden belongs to a true St. Lawrence family. She and her sisters (Kathy, a Fashion Design grad from '79, and Kelly, who studied Graphic Design ('89)), hold a total of five St. Lawrence College diplomas!

Houlden, leading the family with three diplomas of her own, is the Director of Supply Chain and Product Group Systems in the Canadian Development and SAP Competency Department within Alcatel Canada's America's Region Information Systems unit. That's a long way from her first introduction to computers back in 1977, as part of her Retail Management program. "I instantly fell in love with computers," says Houlden, "and changed my career plans away from retail, and toward a computer science / business administration path."

"The excellent courses that I took in the Business Administration curriculum prepared me for both a future in computer systems analysis and business process support," she explained. "Getting a solid understanding of computers and programming landed me my first job and enabled the start of a long and rewarding career working with computer systems. Having a good knowledge of how the business worked helped me greatly. Specifically, knowing the entire chain of the manufacturing process, and how financial transactions intertwined to make a company operate was instrumental in my success. All of my career has been spent applying business process knowledge to computer application systems."

While at St. Lawrence, Houlden (nee O'Neill) played varsity basketball, as well as hockey, a sport that she has continued on with to this day. "I've played at all levels of skill, from Senior A down to the current recreational level," says Houlden. "One year our team even won the Senior C Provincial Championships."

Houlden began her career path as a Junior Programmer for Digital Equipment in Kanata in 1979. Over the next eight years she rose to the top programming position of Principal Programmer / Analyst. She then switched her focus to business analysis within the Manufacturing and Materials Division, eventually moving up the corporate ladder until she became the Manager of Business Systems Support Team, with responsibility for all applications systems used in the Kanata manufacturing and distribution facility.

After a few more career moves including a stint as consultant, as well as work assignments in Toronto, Montreal and Ottawa, Houlden chose to settle into Silicon Valley North. "After finding the traveling too hard on my home life, I returned to another large hi-tech firm, Alcatel, located in Kanata (now Ottawa) where I could pursue my love of working with ERP systems in the supply chain area."

As a world leader in the high speed access and optical transport market, Alcatel is a major player in the area of telecommunications and the Internet. A strong local presence in 130 countries, Alcatel has over 110,000 employees worldwide. In 2000, its sales were EURO 31 billion, 85 % of which were from telecommunications. It is a world leader in ADSL equipment, terrestrial and submarine optical networks, public switching, fixed wireless access, and intelligent networks, with it's headquarters in Paris, France. Alcatel Canada began its operations in 1986. It currently has 12 offices across the country, with it headquarters based in Ottawa.

Houlden is responsible for providing support for the supply chain components of the company's ERP application system called SAP. She also provides support for the applications that support the product business units for component engineering and product

Ontario Power Generation and St. Lawrence College Erect Wind Turbine in Cornwall



On September 19, Ontario Power Generation (OPG) and St. Lawrence College of ficially opened a new 30 metre tall, 40 kilowatt wind turbine on the College's Cornwall campus.

"This installation is part of OPG's corporate commitment to utiliz-

ing and showcasing the viability of clean, renewable energy," said OPG's Murray Paterson. "Recently, we unveiled the largest wind turbine in North America, located in Pickering, and are involved as partners in Huron wind, Ontario's first commercial wind farm near Kincardine. We are building a variety of other commercial-scale and demonstration-scale renewable energy projects."

"It is fitting that this Windmill Point site will once again be home to a windmill," said Pat Finucan, the College's Cornwall Campus Director. "The College is thrilled to be the operator of this wind turbine, and we look forward to integrating its operation into our curriculum."

The College, according to local historians, is built on land where a working windmill once stood.

"The old windmill on this site once provided energy in harmony with its environment. The modern wind turbine donated by OPG brings that harmonious partnership with nature back to Cornwall's riverfront," continued Finucan. "We're proud to be rekindling old memories while manifesting a commitment to clean energy."

Joining OPG and St. Lawrence College in the project is the St. Lawrence River Institute of Environmental Sciences, an organization dedicated to research on large river ecosystems. All three organizations plan to monitor the effectiveness of the turbine as well as explore the educational opportunities of the emission-free source of electricity. "The project reflects our mutual commitment to the environment," said Finucan.

Last winter OPG announced the creation of OPG - Evergreen Energy, part of a five-year plan to quadruple the company's portfolio of clean, renewable "green power." Ontario Power Generation is an Ontario-based company, whose principal business is the generation and sale of electricity to commercial customers in Ontario and to interconnected markets.

Honorary Diploma Presented to Olympic Triathlete Sharon Donnelly


Each year, the Board of Governors of St. Lawrence College recognizes the outstanding achievements of individuals or groups whose accomplishments are of such excellence, inspiration and leadership that they serve as examples for the students of our College.

Traditionally, the presentation of an honorary diploma coincides with spring convocation. However, Olympic Triathlete Sharon Donnelly was literally "on the run" at convocation time last spring, and so we were pleased to be able to "catch up with her" at Kingston's Student Awards Night on November 1.

Donnelly, through her international athletic achievements, has been a tremendous ambassador for the city of Kingston. A native of Toronto, she was the first Canadian triathlete to meet the 2000 Canadian Olympic Association triathlon criteria. Her greatest triathalon success to date occurred in 1999 at the Pan American Games in Winnipeg, where she won the gold medal. She has been a member of the National Triathalon Team since 1996.

Donnelly is a retired Captain in the Canadian Army, having graduated with a BA in Commerce from Royal Military College.

However, it is Donnelly's involvement in a wide range of volunteer initiatives, which serves to distinguish



Because it outgrew the lab space at Queen's University, the President of Cortec, Kevin McDermott, searched for a new location to operate his company. Fortunately for our program, Cortec has taken up residence on the Kingston SLC campus.

Cortec is a DNA service company that makes custom DNA and provides automated DNA sequencing services. Cortec has an international clientele that represents a broad spectrum of biotechnology users. They range from purely academic research labs, the Research Institute or the Human DNA Diagnostic Lab, to pharmaceutical companies or large biotech companies.

Cortec offers a variety of benefits to the College's Biotechnology program including work experience opportunities, tours of their facility for potential and students, and for our 1st, 2nd, and 3rd year students they offer a first hand look at a real biotech facility.

To quote from the Ministry:



New College Charter Legislation is "Historic"

Toronto, Ont., Dec. 4, 2001 - Legislation introduced at Queen's Park today to establish a new charter for Ontario's 25 colleges of applied arts and technology will allow the colleges to be more flexible, entrepreneurial, responsive and market-driven.

The charter legislation, which will provide a new framework for college governance, was introduced this afternoon by Dianne Cunningham, Minister of Training, Colleges and Universities (MTCU).

"This is a truly historic occasion for Ontario's colleges," says Susan Bloomfield, chair of the Association of Colleges of Applied Arts and Technology of Ontario (ACAATO). "A new charter will give the system greater flexibility to meet the needs of our students, our communities, the job market and the provincial economy in the context of the global marketplace. Further more, it recognizes the key role that Ontario's colleges play in Ontario's economic and social development."

The new charter legislation is the result of more than two years of broadbased consultation involving a variety of provincial stakeholders, including the business sector, government leaders, students, the internal college community and MTCU representatives.

Once enacted, the charter will allow colleges to continue to respond to community needs while evolving in ways not imagined when the system was established nearly 35 years ago, says Tim McTiernan, chair of ACAATO's Committee of Presidents.

"This is not a cookie cutter approach," McTiernan says. "We consulted widely with college stakeholders to ensure that this charter would address as many issues as possible within the context of a diverse system of colleges. We reached a consensus on many issues, but also found that in other areas, our diverse nature meant that a one-size-fits-all solution does not exist. Therefore, a cornerstone of the new charter will be the allowance for this diversity."

SUNY Potsdam Open House Held on Brockville Campus

The State University of New York (SUNY) opened its first satellite office in Canada at the Brockville campus on September 27.

In April, 2001, St. Lawrence and SUNY Potsdam signed an historic joint admissions agreement to facilitate the transfer process for students from two-year programs at St. Lawrence to four-year pro-

grams at SUNY. The agreement allows St. Lawrence students to seamlessly transfer to SUNY Potsdam. Once students have earned a diploma at St. Lawrence, they may transfer into the junior class at SUNY Potsdam in order to complete bachelor's degrees.










Business: Fredrik Ohlund Business Administration - Marketing, Cornwall, '84
