PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

The Community Integration through Co-operative Education (CICE) program is a two year certificate program designed for adults with developmental disabilities, intellectual disabilities, acquired brain injuries or other significant learning challenges who wish to further their education/vocational training in a community college setting.

As a student, you will have the opportunity to complete an individualized program of study made up of courses from an area of concentration selected from St. Lawrence College's program offerings. Your choice may be dependent on seat availability and program suitability. Course work will provide you with opportunities to develop and enhance your academic skills. Through field placement experiences arranged by CICE program staff, you will develop or refine your abilities in a number of potential work environments. Students can expect to be visited on their placements by our Faculty Advisors periodically throughout each semester.

You will receive support such as curriculum modification, note taking, tutoring, and other related academic services as needed. Upon successful completion of all courses and the field placement requirements, you will graduate with an Ontario College Certificate in CICE. Students will receive course summaries from each successfully completed course.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Students graduating from the CICE program will be prepared for a variety of entry-level jobs depending on their selected area of concentration. As well, some students may choose to enter other college programs after completing the CICE program, if admission requirements are met.

THE GOALS OF THE PROGRAM ARE TO SUPPORT STUDENTS TO:

- participate with equal opportunity in college programs and activities
- develop and test skills for potential employment
- develop and strengthen functional academic skills in order to facilitate effective work habits
- pursue personal areas of academic/vocational interest
- function independently through the development of social and personal skills for success
- strengthen self-management and interpersonal skills such as self-confidence and self-esteem in order to enrich the quality of life and enhance performance as an employee and team member
- contribute to the provision of a healthy, safe work environment

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD), Ontario Secondary School Certificate (OSSC), Certificate of Accomplishment, or be at least 19 years of age by the start of classes and submit a complete application, which demonstrates:

- academic needs that require curriculum modification in order to succeed;
- the ability to provide his or her own transportation to and from the college and field placement locations;
- a level of independence which does not require constant supervision; and,
- a willingness to participate fully in the program.

STAGES OF THE APPLICATION AND SELECTION PROCESS

Please note: Application packages received after the deadline will be placed on a waiting list depending on eligibility.

STAGE ONE

- Attend an information session.
- Fill out an Ontario Colleges application form (online: www.ontariocolleges.ca).
- Complete and submit the CICE application package to St. Lawrence College's Admissions office (package available at www.stlawrencecollege.ca/programs then choose Community Integration through Cooperative Education).
- As part of the application package, provide a confidential reference from an individual who has extensive knowledge of the applicant in an academic or vocational setting (family members excluded).

STAGE TWO

- Attend a personal interview and skills assessment.

STAGE THREE

- Attend the CICE Student Orientation held the week before fall classes begin.

STAGE FOUR

- Students may be required to submit a current CPIC (criminal background check) and completed Placement Immunization Form by November of their first year of study.
