Janet Venn-Jackson

Professor of Music Theatre Program Coordinator



Janet Venn-Jackson has enjoyed an extensive and successful teaching and choreographic career spanning over 30 years. Her ongoing commitment to professional development and remaining current with today's dance industry has Janet judging dance events across North America as well as attending workshops and conventions. She is also the Principal of the ADAPT Teacher's Training Program in Canada. She has contributed to and edited one of the major tap teaching encyclopedias in North America, which remains widely in use today.

Janet has choreographed for such major corporations as Quaker Oats and Mattel Toys and even a half time show for the NFL in a game between the Dallas Cowboys and the Buffalo Bills. A professional dancer herself, Janet has performed in over 50 CBC, Global TV and live performances including the ACTRA and Juno Awards and the Tommy Hunter Show.

Janet has choreographed many of the College's musical theatre productions over the past several years including 42nd Street, Anything Goes, Les Misérables and Crazy For You (2014).

Patrick Burwell

Professor of Music Theatre



Patrick is a proud member of CAEA, AFM, and ACTRA, and has enjoyed a successful professional career spanning 20 years. He has worked as an actor, director, musical director, arranger, producer, and writer at theatres from Victoria to Charlottetown in more than 90 productions.

As a director, musical director and arranger, his credits include the Dora nominated original Canadian musical hit *Top Gun! The Musical* (Factory Theatre), *The Jungle Book, La Cage Aux Folles, Elf: The Musical* (Canadian premiere), *Legally Blonde* (Neptune Theatre), *Leader of the Pack, Swing!* (Drayton Entertainment), *You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown* (Canadian Tour), *Billy Bishop Goes to War, Little Shop of Horrors, A Closer Walk with Patsy Cline, The Buddy Holly Story* (Sudbury Theatre Centre), *Emily* (TIFT), over twenty shows as resident musical director for Norwegian Cruise Lines (including coproductions with Cameron Mackintosh and Andrew Lloyd Webber), and seven productions of *Forever Plaid*.

As an actor, Patrick has played leading roles in such shows as 2 Pianos, 4 Hands (Richard), Glorious! (Cosme McMoon), Forever Plaid (Frankie), I Love You, You're Perfect, Now Change (Man 1), Into the Woods (Cinderella's Prince), Billy Bishop Goes to War (Narrator), Baby (Danny), A Grand Night for Singing (Jason), Cinderella (Prince Charming), The Buddy Holly Story (Norman Petty), Dads in Bondage (Joey), as well as touring internationally with industrial shows and cruise lines.

Over the span of his career, Patrick has worked in commercials, television, and the recording studio both as a producer/arranger as well as a performer on a variety of

projects, including many years of writing and arranging for commercial industrial shows for a variety of corporate clients.

Patrick has written and arranged new Canadian works for both cabaret (over 25 shows) and at the Toronto Fringe, including *Waiting for Trudeau*, and *Nursery School Musical*, both of which were critics' picks and awarded the 'Best of Fringe'. Patrick remains active in the profession, and continues to write and arrange, with several projects in development.

Christopher Coyea

Professor of Music Theatre



Christopher Coyea received his Bachelor of Music Degree from Wilfrid Laurier University, and did post-graduate work in Opera Performance. Chris has established a well deserved international artistic reputation as a performer in Opera and in concert and was an award winner in the prestigious Lauritz Melchior Heldentenor Competition in New York City.

As a member of the Canadian Opera Company Ensemble, he has appeared in numerous productions, including *Salome*, *Tristan und Isolde*, *Queen of Spades*, *Carmen*, *Wozzeck* and *The Tales of Hoffmann*. After leaving the Ensemble, he performed with the Toronto, Winnipeg, Victoria and Kitchener-Waterloo Symphony Orchestras, as well as Orchestra London and the Hamilton Philharmonic. He has sung in the company of such singers as Dame Joan Sutherland, Placido Domingo, Carol Vaness, Dolores Ziegler, Ben Hepner and Richard Margison, just to name a few.

His European engagements include Canio in *Pagliacci*, Kaspar in *Amahl and the Night Visitors* and Tenor Soloist in Haydn's *The Creation*, Rossini's *Petite Messe Solennelle*, Saint-Saens' *Oratorio de Noel*, Beethoven's *Christus am Oelberge*, Mozart's *Requiem* and Mahler's *Das Lied von der Erde*. Chris was also featured in a nation wide German tour of *Carmen* in 2003. Recent North American appearances include *The Taming of the Shrew* with Pacific Opera Victoria and Tenor Soloist in *A Salute to Vienna* in Montreal, Hamilton, Melbourne and St. Petersburg.

Mr. Coyea has musically directed many shows at St. Lawrence College most recently including *Les Misérables*, *Anything Goes* and *The Mikado*.
