Small Changes at Home!

- Switching to a bamboo toothbrush instead of a plastic one!

- Bar soap tends to come with less packaging!
- Meal plan to reduce food waste!
- Swap your disposable razor for a metal reusable one!
- Serve dinner with cloth napkins!
- Switch out tissues for handkerchiefs
- Line dry instead of using a dryer (when it is possible)!
- 5-10 minutes showers!

- Saying no to plastic straws or bringing your own reusable metal straw!
- Bringing reusable bags and produce bags when you go grocery shopping
- Make sure to bring your reusable bottle for water!
- Ask for a real mug when staying in the cafe!
- Pack a lunch instead of eating out which saves money too!
- Eco-containers tri-campus!



Recycle Everything with TerraCycle!

TerraCycle is eliminating the idea of waste by recycling the "non-recyclable." Whether it's coffee capsules from your home, pens from a school, or plastic gloves from a manufacturing facility, TerraCycle can collect and recycle almost any form of waste.

The Zero Waste Box platform allows us to recycle almost everything! Now you can pick and choose which waste streams you would like to recycle at your home or office.

Simply select which box you would like, order it online, fill it up, and ship it back! That's all it takes to start moving towards zero waste.

TerraCycle offers free recycling programs funded by brands, manufacturers, and retailers around the world to help you collect and recycle your hard-to-recycle waste. Simply choose the programs you'd like to join; start collecting in your home, school, or office!

The campus bookstore will no longer be offering plastic bags starting September 2019!

Paper Straws

Around 500 million plastic straws are used and thrown out daily in North America. Biodegradable paper straws or reusable metal straws eliminates this plastic waste.
