1 FIND YOUR PROGRAM

Highly Competitive Programs
A program for which the number of qualified applicants exceeds the number of seats available. Applications, including all relevant and up-to-date transcripts, for highly competitive programs need to be submitted by February 1st. 3 APPLY TO SLC!

Canadian Citizens/Permanent Residents

- When you're ready, apply to SLC using the Ontario College Application Service (OCAS) at ontariocolleges.ca. Applications open in October. You can get offers to non-competitive programs as early as November 1!
- Apply early! The Equal Consideration Date for all programs is February 1, 2024. SLC accepts applications after this deadline for programs that are still open, but we encourage you to apply before February 1.
- Check program status (Open, Closed, Waitlisted) after the Equal Consideration Date at ontariocolleges.ca
- Check your email after you apply for your slc.me student portal login credentials.

Tip: When applying through ontariocolleges.ca, use your personal email and check it regularly for updates to your application!

4 SUBMIT DOCUMENTS/TRANSCRIPTS

Currently in high school in Ontario

- Let your guidance office know that you have applied to SLC, and they will send your transcript to ontariocolleges.ca electronically.
- Check your online OCAS application after final first semester marks, second semester mid-terms, and final marks are issued to ensure the grades they've sent are accurate.

Not currently in high school in Ontario

- Have your high school transcripts sent via OCAS. Learn more at ontariocolleges.ca

Currently in, or have graduated, college or university

- Order your transcript from your college or university and have it directed to the Admissions Office at SLC or to OCAS.
- Check your email and your slc.me student portal for any additional requirements and application updates.

Canadian Citizens and Permanent Residents Educated Outside of Canada

5 TRACK AND ACCEPT YOUR OFFER

You're almost there!

- Track your application status and find any outstanding items or conditions in your slc.me student portal.
- When you're ready to confirm, click the green "Accept" button next to your offer on your OCAS application by the due date indicated on your account.
- For most programs, you must confirm your offer by May 1, 2024, to avoid the risk of losing your seat to someone on the waitlist (if applicable to your program).
- Watch your email for communication from our Admissions team about your next steps after accepting your offer.
- Pay your tuition deposit by the mid-June 2024 due date (exact date to be confirmed).

- Group counselling and workshops support building skills for stress management, substance use, relationships, and well-being.
- Crisis and after-hours supports are a call or text away, available 24/7 through community organizations and digital resources.
- Spiritual support is available, regardless of your denomination, faith tradition, or spiritual conviction. Our Spiritual Care Facilitator provides one-on-one support and group huddles.

Facilitated admission for Indigenous students considers applications to highly competitive programs while placing less weight on background academic performance.

If you apply in this pathway, you must:

- Meet the minimum entrance requirements for your program choice(s) to be considered for a highly competitive program.
- Complete the Facilitated Admission for Indigenous Student form by February 1.
- Complete your application to St. Lawrence College with all transcripts and proof of enrolment through ontariocolleges.ca by February 1.
- Provide required documentation/proof of Indigenous ancestry.

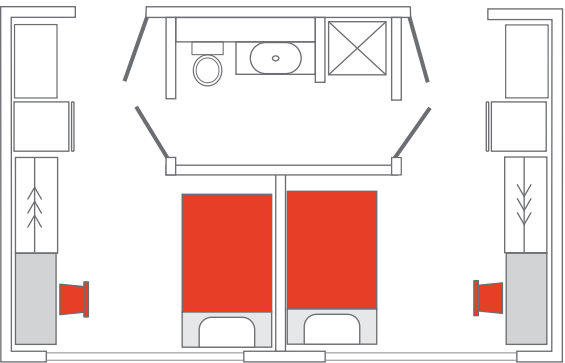

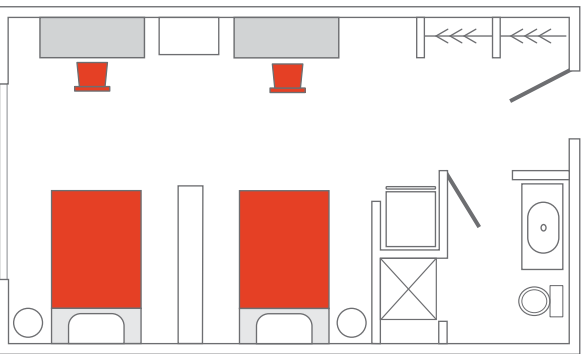
Kingston campus: single suite

BUDGETING FOR COLLEGE
